
Annual Title 1 School Parent Engagement Survey

Greeting Parents,

A key component for building a solid foundation for reading in all of our learners is ensuring children have access to books at school and at home. In addition, your child's books should be appropriate for his or her level. Twice this year your child's teacher administered the Benchmark Assessment System (BAS) to determine your child's reading level. Teachers use the information from the BAS to develop their instruction to best support each child's reading development. Children may also stretch their skills by choosing books above their level, based on their interests. Below you will find a brief guide to where your student should currently be based on his/her grade level:

Kindergarten: Level D

First Grade: Level J

Second Grade: Level M

Third Grade: Level P

Fourth Grade: Level S

Fifth Grade: Level V


Math Magic News




Congratulations Mathletes! On Saturday, April 7, 2018 seven fourth and fifth graders represented Morrow Elementary at Coral Springs High School for the **BCCTM Math Competition**. Each team was led by their 4th Grade Coach, Ms. Imbert and by their 5th Grade Coach, Ms. Servan.

Our Mathletes had to work as a team to answer eight questions. Each question had to be answered in 4 minutes. Each minute had points weighted. The quicker the problem was solved, the more points the team made. The students also had to do an individual test. Morrow Elementary was in competition with 90 other schools! The students and coaches were proud of the work they did as a team. Many parents were there to cheer and support their mathlete. In the 2018-2019 school year, encourage your students to be part of the Morrow Math Club. Information on the criteria for the next competition will be in your welcome packets in August.

April was **FSA** season! On April 24th -26th, the 3rd, 4th and 5th students took their FSA state exams in Math. Parents and students, although the exams are over, please continue to have your students practice on i-Ready and KhanAcademy.com. They need to know how to convert measurement, understand multiplication tables, add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions. This will allow them to be ready for the next grade level. Parents, encourage your children to believe in their abilities the way you believe in them!

Grade Level Happenings

Headstart and Pre-K

Greetings Families!

Here are some language development tips to help your child over the summer.

- Verbally give your child specific one-step and two-step directions and encourage him to follow through. Read to your child for a combined total of at least 20 minutes each day.
- While reading, point out how to hold a book (right-side up with the spine on the left) and the orientation in which we read the words and look at the pictures (left to right).
- After reading, ask your child what happened in the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
- Give your child plenty of opportunities to draw (without coloring books). Ask her to draw the things she sees around her.
- Teach your child the uppercase and lowercase letters and, most importantly, the sounds each letter makes through play and games.

Kindergarten

Hello Parents,

In Math our kindergarten students have been busy learning new math skills, which include identifying numerals, showing number representations, and using addition and subtraction. They have learned how to count, read and write numbers up to twenty. They will move forward in math by learning how to identify and describe shapes (squares, circles, triangles, rectangles, hexagons, cubes, cones, cylinders, and spheres). They will also analyze, compare, create and compose shapes.

In reading they are mastering sight words and becoming strong readers through their knowledge of letters and sounds recognition. Using literacy centers, reading groups, and IReady, the students have been growing in leaps and bounds!

In science, students have learned about the different states and changes of matter (physical, chemical, gas). Using the Science4Us curriculum students are engaged through standards-based digital and real-world experiences using the 5 E's to kindergarten (engage, explore, explain, elaborate and evaluate).

We also have an upcoming field trip to Swim Central, which will teach our students about water safety and swimming skills. It is a two-week experience for students. An informational notice was sent home which included contact information from the kindergarten team for any questions or concerns.

Grade Level Happenings

First Grade

Hello Morrow Families,

It has been such joy and pleasure covering some of the most interesting topics in our first-grade classes.

The past few weeks in Math we worked on graphing data and learning about 3 dimensional shapes.

In Language Arts we focused on Phonics and retelling the main ideas in a story. We compared different characters. Students can now explain the author's purpose for writing a story.

In Social Studies students learned interesting facts about our country. The students had fun completing projects depicting the information they learned about other countries around the world.

In Science we delved into topics concerning the stars and constellations. In acknowledgement of Earth Month our students completed assignments and activities on how they can be helpful stewards in protecting their planet.

The students had a wonderful time as they explored the hands-on exhibits at the Museum of Discovery and Science on April 5th.

We are looking forward to our next field trip. On Friday, May 5th the students will attend Broward Center to see the play "The Ugly Duckling."

Second Grade

We are excited to start the fourth quarter of the year and finish strong. Our second graders are diligently working on improving their reading skills to prepare for the upcoming EOY (End of Year) test. Please encourage your child to read at home every day, for at least 20 minutes to enhance their proficiency in reading. This may also include online programs such as MyON or i-Ready. In math, we are learning how to tell time on a clock, the value of money and the concept of measurement. In writing, we learned how to write opinion and narrative paragraphs. Our focus for Social Studies is economics. The students learned how to identify the benefits of saving or spending money.

End of year conferences are in progress. Please plan to attend your child's conference to discuss your child's progress. We want to collaborate with you to ensure that your child achieves beyond their expected targets. Your input and ideas will be greatly appreciated. Science Success - Ms. Small-Williams

As the end of the year quickly approaches, I am elated to reminisce on our science journey. Students in Kindergarten through fifth grade had wonderful, hands-on scientific adventures. In the primary grades our learners were actively engaged in "Science Matters" story time moments, making observations while creating real-life rainbows, discovering the adaptations of various animals and understanding the life cycle of plants (to name a few).

To add, our intermediate learners were very competitive with our Benchmark Questions-style games, scientific jeopardy, studying adaptations of plants and animals creating "planimals", observing rocks collected on our campus – identifying and categorizing to see if any of the designs and textures were similar to sedimentary rocks, igneous rocks or metamorphic rocks. Students also delved into creating interactive science notebook journals as a resource to refer to for studying and recalling pertinent science information. It was enjoyable exposing students to the Frayer Model to create vocabulary words.

Our learners were excited to demonstrate student-led hands-on live experiments. The volcano display and creativity from some of our 4th Grade Learners was simply fantastic. It was a joy to watch as our learners implement the Scientific Method as they proceeded to carry out the erupting volcanic experience. They were so focus and engaged.

Additionally, it would be very remiss of me if I did not mention the continuous participation from our Marvelous Steppers. Members of the Step Team volunteered to research various experiments and conducted them at our Science Fair. Some of the experiments included:

- "An Ocean Lamp with a Twist"
- "Wildcat Fluffy Slime"
- "Morrow Clear Slime"
- "The RGL Volcano"
- "Water Penny Drop"
- "K-D Penny Wash"
- "The Oobleck Slime Experiment"

While facilitating, I was able to hear our students use accountable talks as they partnered with peers to explain their hypothesis, possible problems, and radical solutions with the student body and our parents. Parents are still expressing gratitude and appreciation for an enjoyable evening.

To conclude, I would encourage you to ask your child to verbally share some of these activities with you. This was an INCREDIBLE school year. Our students are continuously striving to be fantastic super scientists. Thank you for an amazing school year!
