Congratulations for taking AP Spanish Language and Culture next school year. In this class you will be challenged to do college-level work. Together, we will work toward your proficiency in interpretive and presentational modes of communication. The variety of themes studied in this course will open-up your eyes to the Spanish world. Throughout this course, you will participate in activities that integrate language and culture, making connections to other disciplines and comparing aspects of the Spanish culture with other cultures. Not only you will be prepared for the AP Spanish Language exam in May, but also exposed to different forms of written and spoken Spanish on radio and TV broadcasts.

The textbook used for this course is *Abriendo paso: Temas y lecturas*. The book is organized around the six thematic units: *Las identidades personales y públicas, La vida contemporánea, Las familias y las comunidades, La belleza y la estética, La ciencia y la tecnología y Los desafíos mundiales.* The units together contain 37 chapters and they evolve from personal themes through global context and issues.

The summer work is intended to familiarize you with the expectations of an AP class for listening, writing and speaking skills, while keeping your Spanish active.

The assignments are due by/on our first class meeting of the second week of school. Late work will not be accepted.

You should have at least five conversations in the log. Note the name of the person and write, in Spanish and what you talked about.
