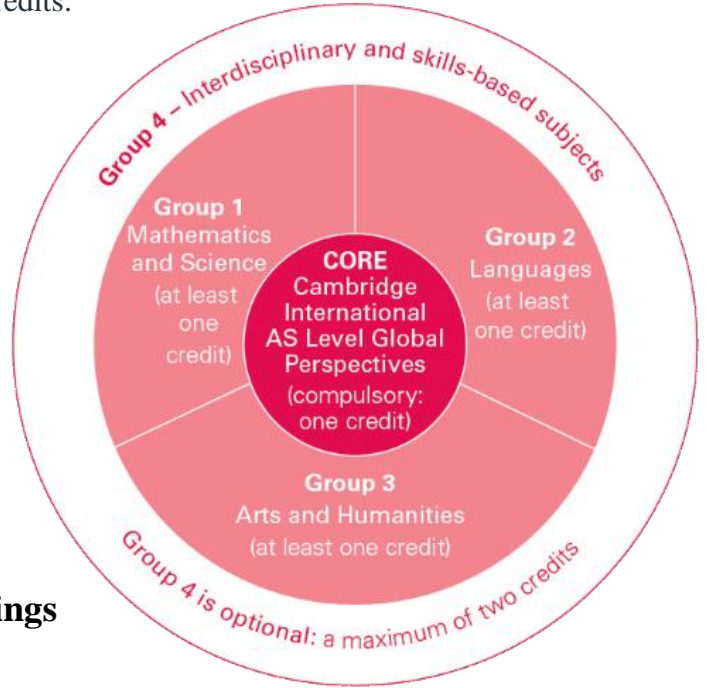

* You can choose from a variety of courses to take your second or third year of the program including Global Perspectives (mandatory to earn the diploma) which you may take in tenth or eleventh grade. The goal is to earn the diploma by the end of eleventh grade.

AICE Diploma Requirements

To earn the Cambridge AICE Diploma, learners must achieve a minimum of **seven credits** (including Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives & Research) from subject groups 1, 2, and 3 (and optionally Group 4). At least one credit must come from each of Groups 1, 2 and 3. The remaining credits can come from any of the groups. A maximum of two credits can count from Group 4. A Cambridge International AS Level is awarded one credit, and a Cambridge International A Level is awarded two credits.
