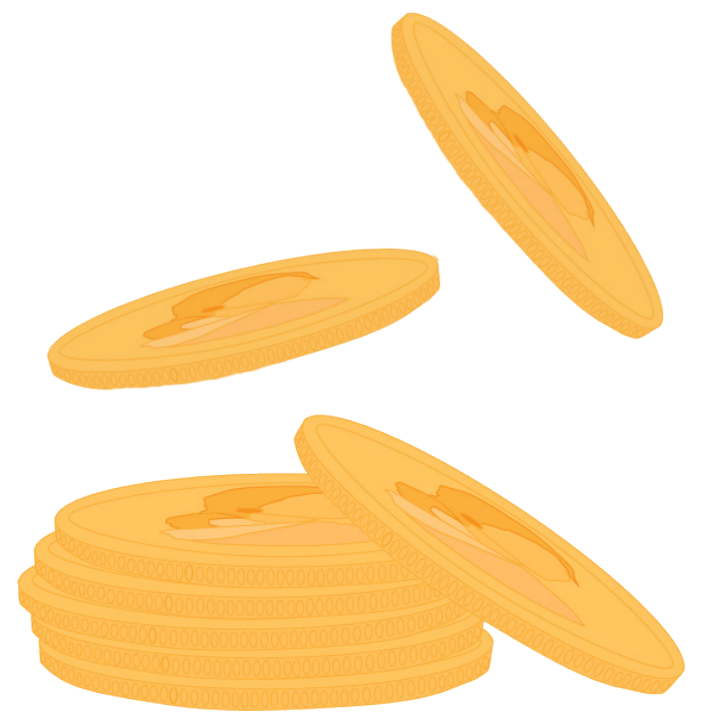

Despite their appearance, school lunches operate well in American teenage diet.

School lunches prove themselves frequent in the life of students. In the lunch room, students can find themselves a variety of options: pizza, pasta, salads, ice cream, parfaits, mashed potatoes, french fries, and chips barely scratch the surface of all that can be found in a school cafeteria.

But what impact does the constant consumption of the foods provided on campus do to the teenage body? The meals themselves carry quite a few nutritional requirements, but if they're enough to sustain a student healthily is up to the question.

If a school expects reimbursement by the U.S. government for serving the proper school lunch, the meals they serve must not have more than 30 calories caused by fat, and must meet 1/3 of the average child's daily intake of proteins,

carbs, and a few specific vitamins.

In surveys conducted in the mid 2000's, it proved increasingly clear that many school meals did not meet the national nutritional guidelines set into place. 1 in 10 schools had meals heavy in saturated fat, known to lead to a slew of problems such as high blood pressure and type 2 diabetes in obtuse quantities. Due to this, 2010's Hunger Free Kid's Act made the many guideline adjustments students know today. Emphasis on healthy whole grains and an increase in vegetable and fruit servings became standard at every school.

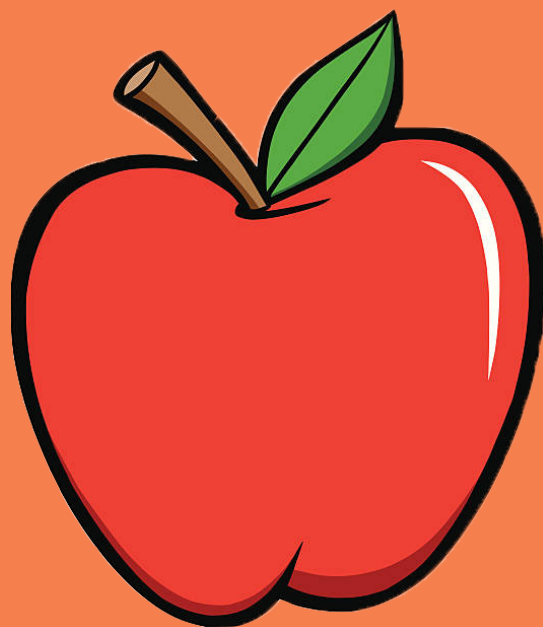
These specific requirements prove notable when cafeteria staff remind you to pick up a serving of fruit before paying for your meal. But what effect do these precautions and requirements truly create upon the teenage diet?

The average teenager should

eat around 2200-2800 calories in a day, leaning on the higher side when mid-development. And with the many provisions of the Hunger Free Kids Act, it seems the nation is doing a good job at providing proper nutrition to the 30 million students fed daily by the National School Lunch program.

This leads to a slew of benefits. The vitamins and minerals found in the vegetables required by the National School Lunch Program, such as zinc, vitamin B, Omega-3s, and proteins, play an important role in the cognitive development of students.

Thanks to the legacy of Michelle Obama, we can safely say that students will not be underfed at their schools if they can help it. Our students hold the power of knowledge in their hands, and it all starts with a warm meal that can easily be found on their school campus.

Bernie Sanders has said that “We are a nation of immigrants. That is, in fact, the strength of America.” He supports the immigration reform to help provide immigrants a better chance of leading fulfilling lives in America and becoming citizens.

One of the few things he supports includes the visa reform which supports the workers, and protects guests and undocumented people from labor exploitation. Labor exploitation can include withholding wages, forcing long work hours, and stealing immigration documentation from workers to prevent them from leaving. Illegal immigrants more often than not come to our country looking for a better life, and any discrimination would be unjust.

Possible ways to reach an economy that accommodates undocumented immigrants and Americans workers without manipulation of wages remain in reach. With many ways to make peace with immigrants where we both can live instead of demonize them as less. Sanders also supports the DREAM Act in which younger undocumented immigrant kids get permanent residency. Sanders continues by trying to stop the separation of kids from their parents by the inhumane process. So much so he was one of many that voted against ICE due to the fact that they are known to deport and separate families.

Sanders believes in building better facilities to hold immigrants. He continues to disagree with President Trump about building a wall against Mexicans trying to come in illegally. He's worked on seven bills to the Senate, and worked tirelessly to overturn the travel ban place on some middle eastern countries, claiming Trump as xenophobic. To his dismay, the Supreme Court supported Trump's decision on immigration ban.

Bernie has called President Trump's plan to eliminate the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, also known as DACA, the “ugliest and

most cruel decision made by a president of the US in the modern history of this country.”

According to feelthebern.org the DACA program, enacted in 2012, allowed unlawful immigrants brought to the United States as young children a two year period to apply for work permits and visas so that they may be eligible to stay in the U.S.. The withdrawal of the program puts many people in a devastating position, and it seems that Bernie would likely bring it back during his presidency.

Bernie's father was an immigrant who came to the United States without anything to do his best and make a better life for his family. Due to this, it is clear to see how Sander's commonly relates to the immigrant experience and often comes to empathize with those searching for a better life. Bernie continually supported programs like DACA and DAPA, or Deferred Action for Parents of Americans.

In 2013, Bernie cosponsored the Uniting Families Act, which would allow people without a marriage license still obtain citizenship if their partner was a legal permanent resident of the United States. The bill originally intended to get the LGBTQ+ community to attain the same rights as heterosexual citizens to bring their partners to America.

Bernie's opposition throughout history to the Zero Tolerance Policy that the standing president supports is immensely clear. Bernie perceives ICE detention centers as inhumane, and it seems that many in the younger generation perceive it as the same. According to Sander's website, 53 percent of Americans maintain a positive view of the Senator, and nearly 4 in 5 Democrats see him favorably in the terms of his policy and beliefs. With such a young and strong crowd standing behind Sanders, it's clear he stands as a strong contender for the position of the President.

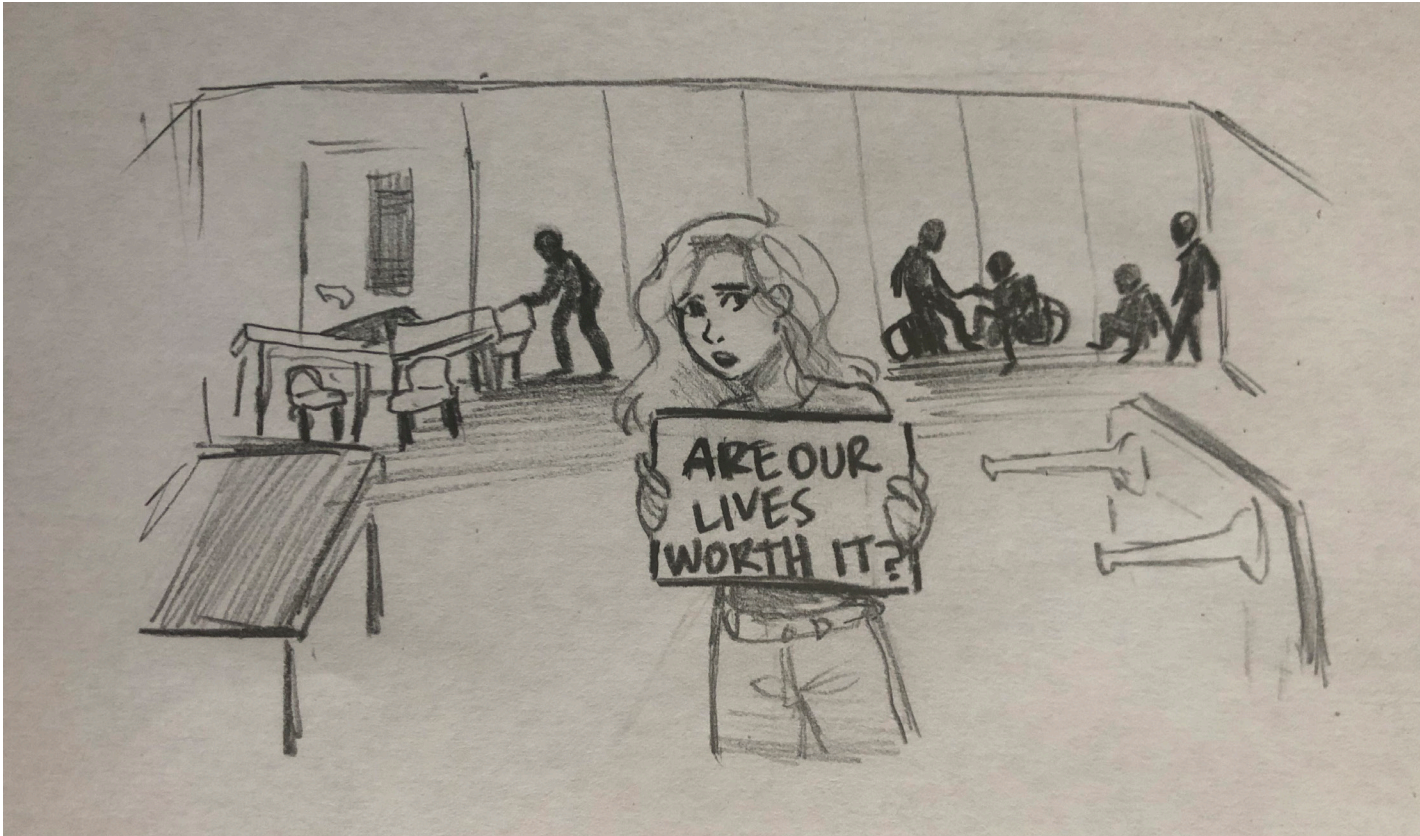

School Shootings Continue

Columbine High School. Virginia Tech Institute. Sandy Hook Elementary School. Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. Santa Fe High School. Santa Clarita High School. These are just some of the many schools in our nation that have endured major amounts of loss, brutality and tragedy. Almost everyday, news reports get sent out of “The Next School Shooting,” so when is enough really enough? When will the ongoing battle of the value of a human life come to an end? How long will it take for real change to occur? Real change can take place at the smallest level: right in the school system.

There are numerous ways that our school and others can change in order to ensure the safety and comfort of those in it. Students, teachers, faculty and staff deserve to come into school every single day and feel unharmed or lack the worry of a tragedy occurring. Logical safety procedures can be implemented. For example, every school is required by law to have a fence around the perimeter of the school in order to create a boundary between itself and the outside community. By installing this fence, it certainly won't guarantee that other individuals won't attempt to enter the campus, but it will delay the efficiency of the unwanted entrances. To continue, another advancement that could jump start a safer environment is to in fact allocate a significant amount of funds towards metal detectors. Metal detectors will not just notify officials of major forms of weaponry but also the minor ones too that may slip in the cracks of one's mundane life. The bringing of hidden blades, small handguns, and other small but deadly weapons onto campus can become preventable with the use of proper metal detectors. It's even easier to implement with the reduced number of entrances to many campuses.

Most importantly, in school, mental health recognition

should take place. More times than not, the threats are not from outsiders but in actuality the threat is already formulated within the walls of what is considered “a safe space.” Based off statistics of the last two decades, the majority of those who cause the shootings in schools, are students or former students themselves. If more time was dedicated to the mental health cause, and not just glamorized by the media, real steps to change can be made. Mental health is not just a term used to label people who belong in the “nut house” as many refer to it as, it goes much deeper than that, and affects the lives of those facing mental health issues. Although this cause does not justify violence nor condone hate and malicious behaviour, if the people within the walls of the school were a little more kinder and compassionate to the fact that not everyone will be all right or okay, events so tragic as the ones listed can be narrowly avoided.

On a more formal note, stricter background checks most certainly can be created in order to ensure a safer purchasing process of the weapons. Unfortunately, the culprit responsible for the Parkland massacre received the opportunity to walk into a gun store in Sunrise. He passed his “background check” but clearly it lacked high levels of security because if they were stricter, red flags would have gone up about his hostile tendencies and unruly behaviour as a student.

All in all, if more precautions were taken at the smallest level, right here in school, the safety and well-being of students would be valued more. Students and teachers are growing exhausted with having to ask the same question of whether or not their lives are important. Students and teachers are infuriated by the news of more lives lost. The time for change is now, because if not now, then when?

Are monthly drills really helping?

Students question effectiveness of the required monthly drills

In the wake of 2018, the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High shooting took place, leaving 17 people dead and 17 others injured. Florida students became subject to an increase in school safety drills. In addition to fire and tornado safety drills already required by state law, Florida students are now required to follow "code red" drills which help prepare students for an armed attacker or active shooter. A new state law about gun control, passed in response to the shooting requires code red drills to take place as often as other emergency drills, such as fire drills, prompting complaints from some students, and teachers that feel that the number of mandated drills play out as excessive and, for some, traumatizing.

At minimum, we find ourselves in

line outside once a month for fire drills and we hide in a dark room during a code red. Students are forced to participate in these often times mundane drills that prove triggering to an already traumatized student.

While I recognize that repetition develops habits, and habits can become an automatic reflex, I can also see where this not only disrupts classwork and the mindset of a post-traumatic victim, but students can very quickly lose the intended focus and importance of these drills when conducted ad nauseam.

My opinion about school safety drills is that they do not need to repeat to exhaustion. I think students and teachers would benefit from having

more programs or classes targeting social behavior especially in a county where guns remain adamantly protected. Additionally, because we live in a state prone to natural disasters such as hurricanes and tornadoes, I think students would learn a lot more from participating in help efforts after a storm. This would give them an insight on what can happen in the event of a real emergency, what causes these extreme climate fluctuations, and how they can prepare themselves.

All in all, I feel that we lack case studies on the effectiveness of frequent school safety drills. Has the increasing of school safety drills helped lower the number of deaths and injuries caused by fires, tornados, and active shooters? These frequent drills impact the emotional health of survivors from school mass shootings. It seems at times that we expend more time and energy in preparing for a disaster verses preventing one.

it was the last game we would ever play with the seniors."

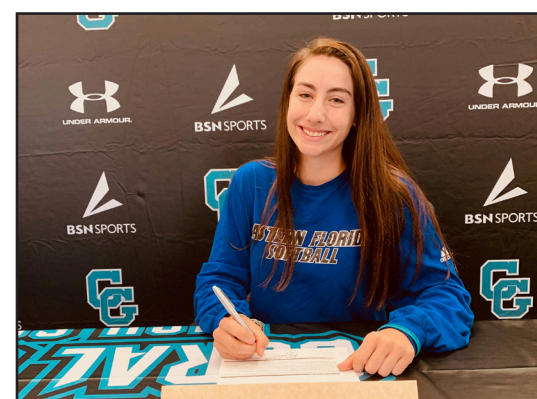

The school held an assembly where a man named Kevin Brooks came and spoke about his tragic experience with distracted driving. He explained how he got into a car accident and became paralyzed from the waist down, and witnessed the passing of his friend due to his distracted driving. He went on explaining how he felt so much guilt afterwards but decided to use his background to help students from doing the same thing. Seniors Victoria Rocha and Alexandria Terhune made their state project about 'X the Text' and brought attention to the seriousness behind texting and driving. "Since Kendell's and Breanha's death, I just wanted to make distracted driving a known risk around the school so we could educate people," Terhune said. It all begins with a pledge to stop distracted driving. By pledging you promise to not text and drive, drive while distracted, or drive in a scenario where you feel you or other people could be in danger, it brings a feeling of accountability back on the students. "It's pledging to do something very simple. By not texting or becoming distracted while driving you're saving your own life and others around you," Rocha said. "I've lost a

close friend in a car accident, so I take safe driving seriously." The project partners show they had one big goal with their project. "It's so people could understand how devastating a car accident could be, not only personally, but [to] a whole community. It brings more awareness to something that is preventable with the right decision," Terhune said. "[We're] making it very public and in-your-face. The point is to show even those not involved that we're coming together for [our cause]." Nine teenagers death's come from car accidents every day. Teaching others that such a small action could spiral into a senseless and unreasonable death can help try to change that. "I personally really hate texting and driving, although I've done it before. It's not worth possibly dying because of a stupid text that probably doesn't even matter," Rocha said. So far, the project partner's impact on the school has proven immense. With X's pasted onto every door promoting their cause, as well as pledge slips handed out to nearly every student, they've shown how well of a job they've really done at getting their message out there. The dedicated work of Rocha and Terhune shows time and time again that when student's find themselves passionate, they will do anything to see that passion come to life.

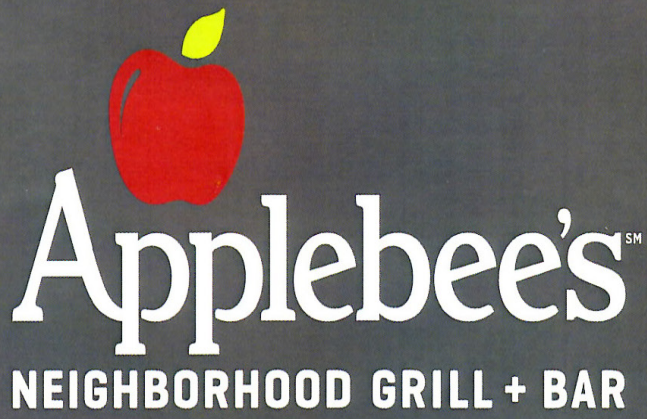
How do you feel about the new renovations to the media center?

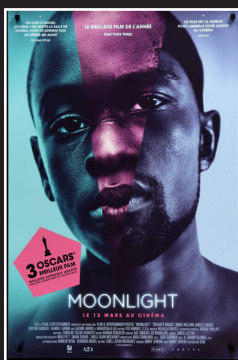
2014

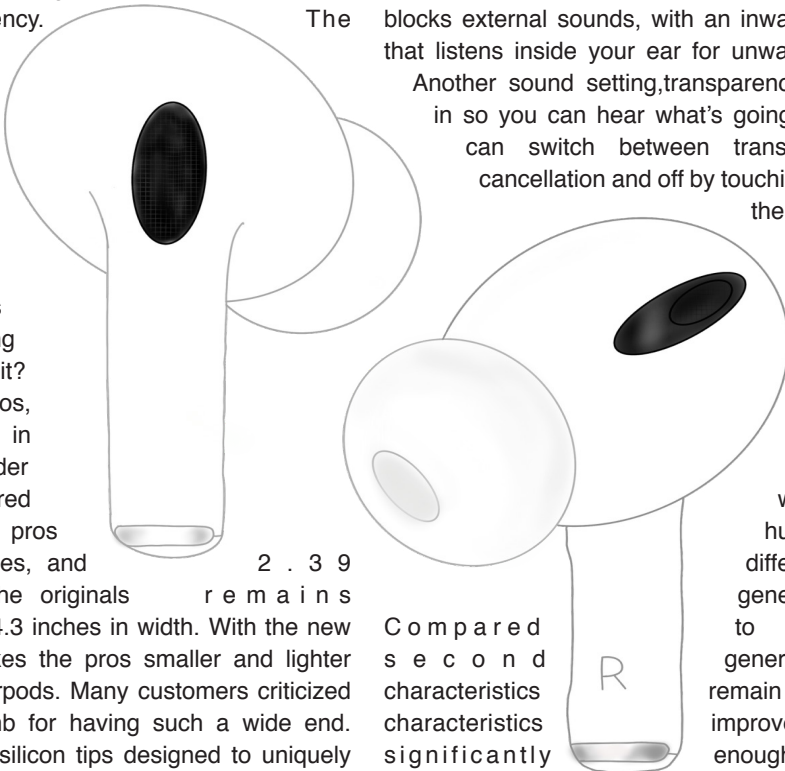
Airpod Pros carry whopping price tag for mediocre product

Apple has introduced its latest product, the brand new airpod pros. It promises various new features such as active noise cancellation, transparency mode and water/sweat resistance. The new device also boasts an improved microphone that cuts down wind during calls, and new silicone ear tips that are designed to comfortably fit your ear all day. It also has new controls such as tapping 3 times to skip back and pressing holding to switch from active noise cancellation to transparency.

The new tech packed device and all its features come at the hefty price of \$249, making it almost \$100 more than the original apple airpods and \$50 more than the second generation apple airpods. With the price placed so high, it has left customers wondering are they really worth it?

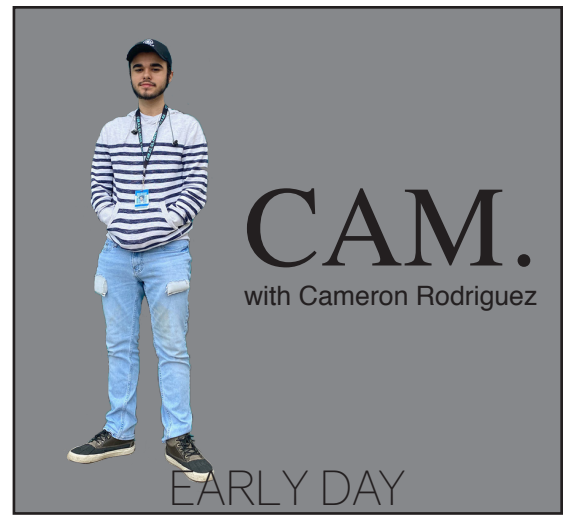
The new airpod pros, presented differently in physical design, have a wider and shorter look compared to the original airpods. The pros height reaches 1.78 inches, and 2.39 inches in width; while the originals remains 5.2 inches in height, and 4.3 inches in width. With the new design changes, this makes the pros smaller and lighter than the 1st generation airpods. Many customers criticized the design, calling it dumb for having such a wide end. The pros also come with silicon tips designed to uniquely fit ears comfortably. This option comes in 3 different sizes, small, medium or large. The newly added ear fit tip test, can see which size would best comfortably fit your ear. This feature only comes with the new airpod pros and not included in the two previous models. Replacement silicone tips sell at \$3.95 each according to Apple's website.



Apple has additionally made the pros water/sweat resistant which has become the first to happen in the brand's headphones. This makes it easier to workout and do other active activities without airpods falling out of your ear. The headphones come water resistant but not waterproof which means it cannot be submerged in water or placed under a running faucet. Three new noise settings components come apart of the apple airpod pros. Noise cancellation blocks external sounds, with an inward facing microphone that listens inside your ear for unwanted internal sounds.

Another sound setting, transparency mode, lets outside in so you can hear what's going on around you. You can switch between transparency mode, noise cancellation and off by touching the force sensor on the side of each airpod.

The airpod pros new high tech features are great but are not worth the expensive \$249 dollar price tag. The features complement the device but not worth the almost hundred dollar price difference to the first generation airpods. Compared to the original and second generation, most of the characteristics remain unchanged. Some characteristics significantly improved slightly but not enough for people to go out and spend a hundred dollars more. This option may be good for people who are active or trouble finding comfortable headphones but overall isn't worth the price. With few differences between the Pros and their originals, it becomes clear that Apple must step up their game in order to see any money from their customers.



Earl Sweatshirt has been in the music industry for a decade now, so it's hard to believe he's only 25 years old. He released his first mixtape, simply called *Earl*, at the age of 15, which made him instantly recognized as a promising prospect in the rap scene. Fast-forward to current day and 4 albums later, Earl is considered a modern legend and a pioneer in the fledgling subgenre of post hip-hop. Once you take a look at his upbringing however, it's not hard to see how this happened. His father, Keorapetse Kgositsile, was a famous South African poet known for his influence in closing the gap between African poetry and black poetry in the United States. Constantly being surrounded by art in his early life influenced Earl's stylistic choices later in life.

Earl released his first public work under the name Sly Tendencies, but quickly dropped the moniker after joining famous rap group Odd Future, where he was joined by other famous members such as well known Tyler the Creator and Frank Ocean. After his first mixtape, Earl received widespread acclaim and it cemented him as the most talented member of the Odd Future lineup. 3 months after this mixtape, Earl was sent to a boarding school in Samoa by his mother as she believed the influences in his life were leading him down a troubled road. During his time in Samoa, Odd Future's popularity had risen to cult like status. Earl states his time in Samoa as the catalyst for his shift in lyrical content, and allowed him to make more focused art which shows on his second release, *Doris*. *Doris's* content explored darker, grittier ideas than his first release and still received similar acclaim. What seems to repeatedly differentiate Earl in comparison to other artists is that he's able to turn underground trends and stylings into mainstream success. Earl's 3rd release and 2nd studio album, *I Don't Like S*** I Don't Go Outside*, is as antisocial and raw as the title shows. The production on the album, dubbed IDLSIDGO by fans, is incredibly minimalist and grimy, and lyrical content is the same way. Earl switches his writing style on this album pretty substantially, replacing intricate and dense rhyme schemes with potent one liners and imagery. The album is also entirely self-produced, which allowed Earl to fully express himself not only in the lyrics but in the instrumentation as well.

3 years passed after the release of IDLSIDGO without any album. In this time Earl released a 10-minute project entitled *Solace* which ended with a message of hopelessness.

"Well time waits for no man and death waits with cold hands," Earl said before the song's instrumental continued on without him. It wasn't until November of 2018 the world get another single from Earl, and it was apparent that he had accepted his path in life. The instrumentation, despite feeling more disjointed than ever before, felt strangely optimistic and hopeful. Earl expressed his values; now surrounded by friends he enthusiastically shouted out on the song. Not long after an album dropped, simply called *Some Rap Songs*. The darkness and grime still apparent, but it's clear that Earl had accepted it and became one with the music. Often, the instrumentals took center stage of any given song, and it's clear it had intention. The use of abstract and chopped samples emphasized the feelings Earl had over his father's death, which occurred just around the New Year of 2018. Despite the experimental nature of the record it has been lauded by many fans and critics as Earl's best record yet.

All in all, Earl's music is unpolished, deeply personal, and incredibly influential in the music landscape. The music he produces shows that not all work has to be positive and joyful to make a substantial impact on the market and on the fans. In an industry of boisterous personalities and albums that overstay their welcome, Earl may just be the reserved, concise artist we need.

Shining She-Ra

For the honor of Grayskull! She-Ra: The Princess of Power is becoming She-Ra and the Princesses of Power in the newest modern reboot of a beloved cartoon. Now parents can reminisce about their past and take pleasure in seeing it repurposed for new generations. It gives new perspectives and outlooks as well, such as LGBTQ reputation. It's a valid concern as Kanye has no problem stirring up chaos in the public eye in order to promote himself whenever a new album is about to drop. This is so well known in fact that it has become a joke that whenever Kanye does something weird in public we can anticipate an album in the near future. Kanye paints this picture of him being persecuted by the public, and even goes as far as to compare himself to Noah on the track "Selah".
