- □ Develop good study habits and time management skills. Use a student planner to keep track of assignments, tests, projects and your school schedule.

- □ Become involved in extracurricular activities. Leadership experience is an important component for some scholarships and special programs.
- □ Start working on your community service hours. 40 hours are needed to graduate and 250 hours are need for a Silver Cord at graduation. In addition, your involvement in community service activities may be given consideration in your admission to colleges and for some scholarship programs.
- □ Encourage you parents to attend Open House to meet your teachers,
- □ Attend the annual College Fair. It is a great way to get information on colleges and universities.
- □ Discover your interests. Begin thinking about colleges and careers that fit well with your interests.
- □ Consider future plans when selecting courses. Check with appropriate individuals regarding requirements for high school graduation, college admissions, Bright Futures scholarships, NCAA Clearinghouse, National Honor Society or technical colleges.
- □ Begin thinking about an internship experience (what, when, where).
- $\hfill\square$  Began working on a work resume.
- □ Take the PSAT in October as a practice for the SAT, which is used in college admissions decisions.
- □ Keep track of your graduation requirements. Each graduating class may have different graduation requirements.
