
# PSE Newsletter Volume 2

Our kindergartners are settling into their classroom routines and becoming independent learners. In the coming months, a great deal of time will be spent on phonemic awareness as we begin to develop young readers. Math will be moving forward with addition and subtraction of numbers through 10. Our Social Sciences include learning about American History, the importance of celebrations, national holidays, and Civics and Government with the purpose of understanding the necessity of rules and laws in our community. The children will also be using the practice of science as they learn all about matter and its properties. This second quarter of kindergarten always has a huge learning growth spurt for our youngest learners. We are excited to watch them bloom!

# First and Second Grade

### First Grade

As we begin our second quarter of first grade, we are very proud of the students and how they are adjusting to the routines of first grade. In English Language Arts (ELA), we will continue to learn new phonics rules, high frequency words, and vocabulary words to help improve reading accuracy and fluency. We will also focus on reading comprehension skills. Please continue reading daily at home. In math, we are continuing to focus on addition and subtraction concepts. The children are learning different strategies to help them become fluent with the basic facts. Independent practice at home will help. In science, we will be making observations that plants and animals closely resemble their parents. We will also recognize that all plants and animals, including humans, need the basic necessities of air, water, food, and space. In social studies, we will continue learning about responsible citizenship in the school community. We will also continue to help our students practice mindfulness — being focused in the moment, and being aware of their thoughts, feelings, and actions. We are looking forward to a busy and productive second quarter



### Second Grade

Dear Parents and Guardians —

It has been a great first quarter in 2nd grade and we are off and running. We are excited about all the new skills that our students will be learning in the second quarter. In math, students will be learning double-digit addition and subtraction, without regrouping and then with regrouping. Students will be asked to read with more rigor and continue to strengthen their comprehension skills. In science, we are going to be learning about severe weather and in social studies we will learn about Native Americans and Colonial Americans. Also, we will be going on a field trip to the Stranahan House in November. We look forward to these exciting challenges and seeing our students' growth. As always, if you have concerns or questions, please contact your child's teacher.



### Third Grade

We are proud of the transition the students have made to third grade and are excited to continue our learning in the second quarter. We are very excited for our field trip to the Palm Beach Zoo this quarter on November 18. We continue to teach Informational and Literature Standards in Reading. It is important for students to read both Fiction and Non-Fiction when reading for pleasure. Students should be annotating the text when reading and should always prove answers with text evidence. This quarter in math, third graders will learn Geometry, Place Value and Addition and Subtraction of multi-digit numbers. In Social Studies, students will learn Geography and Government. In Science, students will continue learning about Plants and Animals. Please continue to have your child read and study their multiplication facts daily. We are looking forward to a great 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter!

# Third-Fifth Grade

### Fourth Grade

Wow! Second quarter already! We are deep into learning so many new topics. In reading, we are focusing on Character traits, Plot, Summary, and Theme. In math, we are learning multiplication and division. In Science we are focusing on Invasive Species with code.org. This is a new piloted computer science program that we are so excited to participate in. In Social Studies, we are focusing on Government through our reading block. Please make sure your child completes their nightly math homework and that you check all communication from your child's teacher.

### Music

Students in Kindergarten and 1st grade shall be exploring music from various cultures throughout the holiday season through both singing and dancing mixed with the use of some percussion. Second graders shall also be singing and dancing to a variety of music from across different cultures along with learning about simple rhythmic notation including quarter notes and rests and paired-eighth notes.

All students in grades 3–5 are playing ukuleles during music class at least through the end of December (possibly longer). This is an exciting and challenging endeavor. One thing that can help make playing these instruments easier is to maintain an appropriate length of fingernails. The fingernails on the left hand should be kept trimmed to no more than the tip of the finger in order to facilitate the fretting of notes. At the same time, it is VERY IMPORTANT that the fingernails on the right hand be allowed to grow to at least the tip of the fingers. The right hand is used for strumming the strings of the instrument. Many of our students either chew their nails or have them trimmed far beyond the tip of the fingers. This can cause strumming the strings to be very uncomfortable. Please support your student by helping them to remember to keep their fingernails at an appropriate length so that they can enjoy this wonderful opportunity.

# Specials Team

### Spanish

I can't believe it is the second quarter already! We have been busy in our Spanish classes learning how to greet our friends and how to introduce ourselves. Students in Kindergarten, First and Second grade have learned how to name our family members. Kindergarten has learned words that start with the vowels "a" and "e" and how to use singular and plural words. First and Second grade are learning the correct punctuation and basic grammar used for sentences in Spanish. Our second graders are able to read basic sentences in Spanish as they practice the sentences with each other. This past quarter, we enjoyed learning about countries around the world where Spanish is spoken. First and Second grade have learned about the music, food, traditions and culture of Mexico while Kindergarten has been learning about Honduras. So much more to come in the second quarter. Ask your child what they have learned. Remember specials teachers see each class only once a week so we cover the information from the book in small chunks. One week I teach the lesson and the following week they complete three pages from their Spanish workbook.



### **Technology**

We have been busy in Technology class. All third-fifth graders have been working on their keyboarding skills. Students have been improving their words per minute and accuracy as they work through lessons on typing.com. Third grade students have completed Computer Basics lessons (parts of a computer, what makes a computer run, using a mouse and computer lab rules). Fourth and fifth have been learning about internet safety (surfing safety, cyber safety, online behavior, email rules and manners and internet search tips).

In tech class, students have been learning how to code. We have been working on skill building lessons as they learn how to do sequential algorithms when programming mazes, puzzles, and debugging programs. Fourth and fifth graders worked on a Science Search Challenge. They learned facts and information about various scientific questions about earth, animals and the human body. I am looking forward to teaching our 3rd-5<sup>th</sup> graders about the growth of plants as our next Science lesson. They will learn how to create a PowerPoint project and present it to the class.

## <u>Art</u>

Greetings from the Art Room!

Quarter I was busy and fun, as we explored mediums and processes across all grades. Our school wide Dot Day mural is finally hung and complete; we are so grateful to the volunteers that helped assemble it! The mural is inspired by our school wide theme "Planting Seeds of Kindness," and each student painted a dot that is now a flower in our garden! Kindergarten used red, Ist grade orange, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade yellow, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade green, 4<sup>th</sup> grade blue, 5<sup>th</sup> grade purple, and even PRE-K participated with pink. As we move into the 2nd quarter; I always find this season flies by with various breaks and celebrations. Classes will focus on creating art as an act of kindness and how to use art to be an activist. As a reminder, most art will not come home as we are assembling yearlong art portfolios, but your artist may have a favorite project or process they may want to share with you, so I encourage you to chat with them about their time in the art studio.

Robotics team has hit the ground running and begun working on the 22–23 competition season. Students are entering the coding and building phase of the season. The game for this season is called slap shot.

VEX IQ Competition Slapshot is played on a 6' x 8' rectangular field configured as seen below. Two robots compete in the Teamwork Challenge as an alliance in 60-second-long teamwork matches, working collaboratively to score points.

Teams also compete in the Robot Skills Challenge where one robot takes the field to score as many points as possible. These matches consist of Driving Skills

Matches, which will be entirely driver controlled, and Programming Skills Matches, which will be autonomous with limited human interaction.
