Content Area Specialist Reports

Eligibility Recruitment Selection Enrollment Attendance (ERSEA)

- The cumulative enrollment for Head Start (HS) and Early Head Start (EHS) for April 2023 was 2007 (ERSEA 1305.7).
- During the month of April, the second Head Start application window for the 2023-2024 school year was opened through April 27, 2023. Families interested in applying were prompted to schedule an appointment directly with Parent Educators at selected school sites.
- Intake staff conducted 423 application interviews in April.
- The HS program continued to accept and process applications for select schools with openings for the 2022-2023 school year. Eligible families were sent an email with the registration steps and required documents needed for enrollment prior to their child attending school.
- Parent Educators and HS Staff continued to assist families with completing HS enrollment forms and school registration.
- The ERSEA Specialist and Early Head Start Specialist continued to process applications.
- The HS Director and HS Key Management Staff updated the enrollment forms and handbook for the 2023-2024 school year.
- The monthly average attendance for April 2023 was 84.64% (ERSEA 1305.8).

Health and Nutrition

- The Health team continued to verify preschool medical records to ensure that all allergies and medical conditions were tracked and communicated to the school staff as needed.
- Follow ups were conducted with parents that needed to provide updated documents prior to expiration.
- The Health team continued to follow up with parents of children that failed vision screening and/or needed further dental treatment.
- Families were provided with information regarding the Department of Health (DOH) and reminders were emailed for children that still needed immunizations prior to their second birthday.
- The Health team continued to monitor and identify the HS database for children in need of Health Insurance and provided information on Florida KidCare to families as needed.
- The HS Nutritionist continued to contact parents to provide nutritional counseling as needed.
- Health and safety supplies were sent to teachers upon request.



Disabilities

- The new Inclusion Specialist shadowed each Inclusion Specialist in the field.
- The Head Start Disabilities team participated in Individual Education Plan (IEP) meetings.
- The Head Start Disabilities team assisted with preparation and planning of "Round Up" events for the 23-24 school year.
- The Head Start Disabilities team attended, "Taming the Dragon" a professional development offered through *Ounce of Prevention*.
- The Head Start Disabilities team supported families with at-home resources as needed.

Mental Health

- The Mental Health team presented the third parenting curriculum workshop session to parents.
- The Mental Health team conducted home visits for children in classrooms that do not have a teacher of record assigned.
- Teachers were supported with follow-up on Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA) screenings of newly enrolled children.
- The Mental Health team completed Behavior Specialist referrals when necessary.
- The Mental Health team shared information with families regarding summer Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) opportunities.
- The Mental Health team continued with ongoing referrals to Early STEPS.
- The Mental Health team uploaded assessment data to ChildPlus from Early STEPS (i.e., Individual Family Service Plans (IFSP).

Parent Family and Community Engagement (PFCE)

- Parent Educators continued to take applications for the 2022-2023 school year for homeless and foster children.
- The Family Service Specialist and Parent Educators continued to provide updated community resources to families.
- Head Start continued to partner with Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies to provide support to families.
- Parent Educators and Social Workers completed their last Parent Educational Workshops.
- Parent Educators and Head Start teachers met to schedule transition meetings for Head Start children.
- Parent Educators met with teachers to schedule Transition meeting.
- Parent Educators and the Family Service Supervisor met with Head Start staff and school staff to create a registration schedule for the 2023-2024 school year.



Family Services

- Parent Educators attended virtual meetings with their families to provide support as needed.
- Parent Educators contacted their families to conduct follow-up meetings.
- Parent Educators assisted parents with uploading the required documents into ChildPlus to complete their applications and update medical information.
- Parent Educators responded to emails from families regarding pending concerns.
- Parent Educators collaborated with the Family Service Specialist to ensure families were supported.
- The Family Service Specialist reached out to outside agencies to provide additional social service support to Head Start families.

Education

- The Teacher Specialists finalized each teacher's Action Plan by reviewing teacher goals and objectives. (Information is documented in ChildPlus).
- The Teacher Specialists analyzed data and reports to prepare for the Focus Area 2 Review.
- The Teacher Specialists visited schools that were affected by the recent flooding to assess the classrooms and determine materials that must be replaced.
- The Teacher Specialists participated in a department professional learning session "Taming the Dragon."
- The Classroom Assessment Scoring System/Professional Development (CLASS/PD) team participated in the District Professional Development Standards and Support (PDSS) professional learning sessions.
- The Curriculum Supervisor and Director completed the End of Year Master Plan requirements.
- The CLASS/PD Team and Curriculum Supervisor met to finalize the professional learning sessions for the 23-24 school year.
- The CLASS/PD team closed out all professional learning courses that were provided for the 2022-2023 school year and collaborated with the Curriculum Supervisor to ensure that all courses were documented in Learning Across Broward (LAB).
- Canvas was updated to include the "End of Year" resources for staff.
- Early Head Start continues to pilot the Learning Genie app. (Parents are actively using the the app and reporting activities they complete at home with their child).
- Early Head Start Teacher Specialists provided ongoing support for Teaching Strategies GOLD.
- Early Head Start Teacher Specialists provided ongoing support to ensure Curriculum Fidelity Checklist protocols were met.
- Early Head Start Teacher Specialists provided ongoing coaching support for staff.
