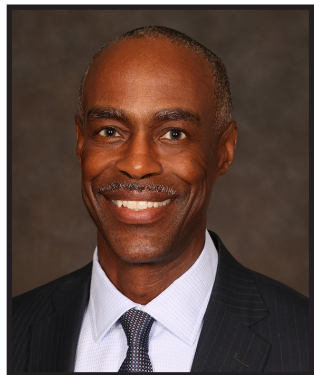


Charles W. Flanagan High School Cheerleaders cheer for both football and competitive cheer.

Alicia Gaines-Holligan

Park Lakes Elementary School

Within her eight years working with fourth and fifth graders, Alicia Gaines-Holligan sums up her philosophy on education as “putting students first.” She tries to view the world through their perspective to better help the next generation grasp the “necessary skills to succeed and help others succeed.” Citing Dr. Earlean C. Smiley, she affirms that “all students can learn, just not on the same day in the same way.” Ms. Gaines-Holligan aligns instruction and social-emotional needs to educate a child as a whole. She was amazed to see how much she was learning from her students’ cultures, worldviews, and unique situations before completing her experience with her most challenging one, her two-year old daughter!

Marc Horowitz teaches because “education is the profession that creates all professions. Teaching is the work of a community, where parent, teacher and child share a joint vision for learning to take place.” Throughout his 23 years as an educator, Mr. Horowitz realized that if students are presented with opportunities, they will rise to the occasion. An alumnus of Broward County Public Schools, he states that the next generation will receive effective education when focus on academics and social and emotional needs are equally considered. Whether it’s learning new technologies or reliving his childhood by playing kickball during recess, this pandemic has taught Mr. Horowitz that students gravitate toward unique and innovative teaching methods. Each day he challenges his students and himself to adapt to changes while making education a priority.

Diverse in her interests and her unabating desire to learn helps to explain the various positions Monika Moorman has filled at Broward County Public Schools. Ms. Moorman's afterschool activities include Broward Gifted Advisory Council board member, Solar System Ambassador with NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory, and National Wildlife Federation Habitat Steward. Ms. Moorman considers education as a journey of self-discovery, where students are empowered to realize their full potential. She believes that it is the teacher's responsibility to challenge the students to become inquisitive, assertive, self-aware, understanding the need for constant growth. "The next generation should be taught," she says, "to stand out rather than fit in." New Renaissance Middle School

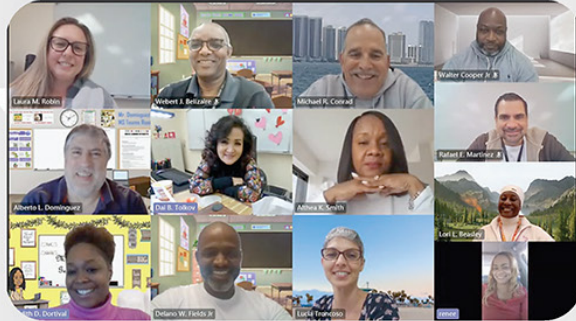

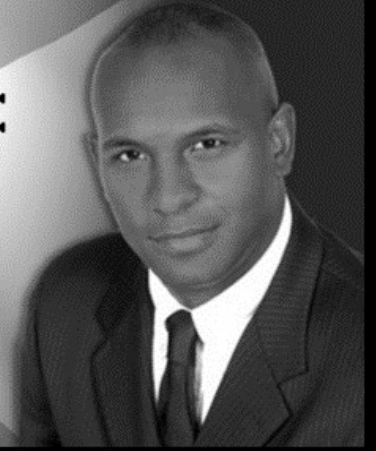
