## The State's Mid-Year Holdback

For the last several years the State Department of Education ("State") has under-projected student enrollment. The State does not have the budget for the additional students; therefore the State implements a mid-year holdback, which impacts all 67 school districts in Florida.

Based on the information provided in the 2013-14 fourth budget calculation, the overall mid-year holdback for the State of Florida was \$51.7 million, resulting from the additional 11,761 students. Broward's school district portion of that holdback was \$4.9 million.

Based on the information provided in the 2014-15 third budget calculation, the current year overall mid-year holdback for the State of Florida was \$62.7 million, resulting from the additional 11,737 students. Broward's school district portion of that holdback was \$5.9 million.
