COMPLETING CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS: State Temporary Certificates

What you need to know to get a Professional Certificate!







Florida State Statute

Florida state statute and administration code require that all instructional staff employed at a Florida public school hold a valid educator certificate.

Temporary certificates are non-renewable and are valid until the expiration date on the certificate.

Review the certificate itself for your expiration date.

A Statement of Status of Eligibility is NOT a certificate.

Certificates are always issued with a start date of July 1st – regardless of when you began employment.

On April 30th of the year your certificate expires, you must have completed <u>all</u> requirements to upgrade to a professional, renewable certificate.



Statement of Status of Eligibility

Your Statement of Status of Eligibility lists ALL requirements you <u>must</u> complete to upgrade to a professional certificate.

You can obtain a copy of your Statement by viewing "Documents" from the quick start menu in your record at the FLDOE.

Is the Statement the same as a certificate? NO!

- Is the Statement important? YES!
- Do I have to complete ALL requirements listed on my Statement? YES!
 - Can I just get an extension if I don't complete all requirements? NO!

You must satisfy all requirements listed on your Statement by no later than April 30th of the year your <u>certificate</u> expires.

This Official Statement of Status of Eligibility outlines requirements for issuance of a Florida Educator's Certificate. For Florida educator certification purposes, college degrees and credits must be earned at institutions that are either accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or approved by the Florida Department of Education. College level credits recommended by the American Council on Education (ACE) are also acceptable.


EXAMS: General Knowledge

The General Knowledge Exam is one of three possible exam requirements you may need to satisfy.

It is a test of your knowledge in four separate areas: math, reading, language arts, and it includes an essay portion.

Do I have options for satisfying this requirement?







EXAMS: General Knowledge - Options

Passing score on the Florida General Knowledge exam earned no more than ten (10) years prior to the date of application

OR

Completion of two semesters of full-time (or the equivalent in parttime) college teaching experience A conferred master's or higher degree – must be on file at FLDOE at time of application for upgrade to professional

OR

Three consecutive years of evaluations, an E or HE overall rating. Must have failed the GK; all evals must be while on a valid FL certificate and after GK attempt date.

OR

A valid professional teaching certificate issued by a US state or territory in an area FL issues certificates OR

OR

A valid National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or the American Board for Certification of Teacher Excellence certificate

OR

Achievement of passing scores on the GRE® revised General Test (must be test date of 7/1/2015 or after)

EXAMS: Professional Education

The Professional Education Exam is another of three possible exam requirements you may need to satisfy.

It is a test of your knowledge in professional pedagogy in the education profession.

EXAMS: Professional Education - Options

Passing score on the Florida Professional Education exam earned no more than ten (10) years prior to the date of application

OR

A valid National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or the American Board for Certification of Teacher Excellence certificate

OR

Three years of evaluations, an E or HE overall rating. Must have completed all course requirements; all evals must be while on a valid FL certificate

OR

A valid professional teaching certificate issued by a US state or territory

OR

Completion of a professional preparation (ACE) program and achievement of an annual evaluation rating of Highly Effective



<u>Professional Certificate:</u> For issuance of a Professional Educator's Certificate valid for five years covering Exceptional Student Education (Grades K-12), official documentation of the following requirements must be submitted to the Bureau or Educator Certification:

 a passing score on the English language Skills subtest of the Florida General Knowledge Test earned no more than ten (10) years prior to the date of application.

• a passing score on the Essay subtest of the Florida General Knowledge Test earned no more than ten (10) years prior to the date of application.

• a passing score on the Math subtest of the Florida General Knowledge Test earned no more than ten (10) years prior to the date of application.

EXAMS: Subject Area

The Subject Area Exam is yet another of three possible exam requirements you may need to satisfy.

It is a test of your knowledge in the specific subject(s) you are pursuing your professional certificate in.

Required regardless of whether you hold a degree in the subject(s).



Exam Prep: Books

- Offered by the Coaching & Induction Department
- Check out General Knowledge, Professional Ed, Subject Area exam prep books for a 30-day period (one book may be checked out per 30-days)
- Contact <u>tashara.jean-baptiste@browardschools.com</u> to request a book
 - you will receive an email within 48 hours to schedule a date and time to check out the book along with other related instructions
 - No walk-ins please must pick up books at the scheduled date/time
- After studying, take a post-test, achieve a score of at least 70%, and receive a voucher for the exam (e.g. to cover the exam cost)
 - Exam voucher will be issued after post-test completion certificate is emailed





PROF PREP: Education Courses

Other than exams, the state requires that you complete training in the field of education through the completion of coursework. This is referred to as "professional preparation".

The coursework is <u>specific</u> to the field of education and the <u>content</u> each course must satisfy is listed on your Statement.

PROF PREP: A Closer Look

A <u>minimum</u> of 15.00 semester hours in education courses with credit in each of the professional education areas listed below. Please note that it <u>may require more than the minimum semester hours to satisfy all requirements</u>.

- classroom management with a focus on creating safe learning environments for students in which effective teaching and learning can take place by promoting a physically, emotionally, socially, and academically secure climate for students
- child and adolescent development including theories and principles of learning
- educational assessment practices that include analysis and application of data from statewide standardized assessments and other multiple sources to improve instruction and learning
- effective instructional techniques, strategies, and materials to meet the needs of diverse learners, including students with disabilities
- instructional strategies for teaching students of limited English proficiency including instruction in the English language and development of the student's mastery of the four language skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing (IMPORTANT: Teaching experience cannot be used to satisfy this requirement.)
- applications of research-based instructional practices in reading (IMPORTANT: May only use experience in teaching Reading or Elementary Education to satisfy this requirement).

practical experience in teaching by completing one year of full-time experience (IMPORTANT: Maximum of one year of teaching experience can be applied toward one requirement and toward three semester hours of minimum semester hours required.)


PROF PREP: Competencies

Other than coursework in the field of education, another way the state is ensured that you have the skills and competencies to be an effective teacher is to have your competencies documented via a checklist.

- The checklist is called the State Competency Demonstration Checklist and is completed by your principal or administrator.
- The Checklist is submitted to the Talent Acquisition and Operations (Instructional) Department upon its completion.
- The Checklist is documentation of your in-practice skills related to the field.
- The Checklist is typically submitted after your first year of teaching under your temporary certificate.

The Upgrade Application Process

Once you have completed <u>all</u> requirements listed on your Statement of Status of Eligibility, you are ready to apply for an <u>upgrade</u> to a professional certificate!

- ✓ Ensure all documentation verifying completion of your requirements has been submitted to the FLDOE
 - If you completed the ACE program, a program representative will ensure that verification of your completion is submitted to the FLDOE
 - If you completed the BEC program, courses via St. Thomas, or courses via another university you are responsible for ensuring official transcripts are submitted to the FLDOE
 - Transcripts may be submitted electronically to the FLDOE directly from the university only and if the university is part of the SPEEDE or FASTER systems (check with your university)
 - If you took the Florida teacher exams (e.g. General Knowledge, Professional Education, and/or Subject Area exams) the FLDOE will automatically receive your scores

Final Notes

- Out-of-field training requirements (including those related to ESOL) are <u>not</u> associated with satisfying requirements to upgrade to a professional certificate. <u>Out-of-field training is separate.</u>
