Objectives:

Students will build a repertoire of useful reading, writing, speaking and listening strategies. Students will strengthen research, critical thinking, and analysis skills. Students will study diverse genres of literature and informational text in a variety of formats in order to gain insight and understanding. Students will apply the writing process through a variety of finished products such as Research Papers, Argumentative Essays, and Informative Essays. Students will engage in basic research processes, including learning and applying proper documentation of sources through MLA formatting and avoiding plagiarism.

Assignments:

Assignments will coincide with the following thematic units:

- Absolute Power
- Responses to Change
- How We See Things

Quizzes:

Quizzes will be scheduled to monitor student progress throughout the semester. All scheduled quizzes will be announced one week in advance. There may also be unannounced quizzes given throughout the semester.

Tests:

Assessments will be administered at the end of each selection and/or major unit of study. Students will be notified a minimum of one week in advance.

Classwork/Homework and Late Work Policy:

Classwork and Homework is due on the date assigned by the teacher, at the beginning of class. Work that is not handed in at the beginning of class will be considered late. If you are found to be working on an assignment during class that was due at the beginning of that class period, it will not be accepted for any credit. Late work is not accepted for full credit. Each day an assignment is late, 10% is deducted. Papers turned in without a name will be disposed of, so make sure all work is labeled

clearly with your name.

Classwork and homework must be completed in blue or black ink or pencil.

There will be participation grades given which consists of coming to class on time with necessary materials and participating in class.

Students who are absent are expected to inquire about and complete any missed classwork and assignments. It is not the teacher's responsibility to seek the student for any missed work.

Students with excused absences are allowed two school days to complete make-up assignments for full credit. If the assignment has already been reviewed and passed back, and the student has exceeded his or her two days, the assignment will not be eligible for full credit.

Students with an absence occurring on a day an assignment is due MUST submit all work immediately upon return if the assignment's due date was previously announced when the student was present in class.
