POS 2041 Dual Enrollment American Government

Instructor: Mr. Patrick G. Abi-Nader, M.Ed., NBCT

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Welcome to Dual Enrollment American Government. Through cooperation with Florida International *University*, this course affords eligible Piper High School students the opportunity to earn 3 college credits, transferable to most colleges and universities, while simultaneously earning the ½ credit in United States Government that is required to earn a high school diploma.

This one-semester class is designed to give students a critical perspective on politics and government in the U.S., and the opportunity to better understand how government functions at the federal, state, and local levels. The course involves the study of the general concepts used to interpret American politics, as well as analysis of case studies of past and current issues. Through practical investigations of how our government functions and the role it plays in our lives, students will learn the importance of civic responsibility and participation in the democratic process.

Students are expected to perform at the collegiate level. The course involves a variety of teaching and learning methods designed to provoke student interest, including discussion, simulations, cooperative learning activities, and independent research and investigation. It is essential that all students are responsible for the assigned readings before arriving to class so that all students can best contribute to each day's activities.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Florida International University describes the course as: POS 2041 American Government (3 credits). Power distribution and policy-making in U.S. Topics include political change; role of majorities; minorities; media, elections in U.S. politics; national institutions; and Florida state and local government.

Twice each quarter you will receive 50 points for class participation. <u>You will lose 10 Points each time you disrupt the class, arrive late to class without a signed Tardy Excused Pass, accumulate 3 unexcused absences, or fall off task.</u>

- 12. Students must occupy themselves productively when they finish an assignment early.
- 13. Return computers, textbooks and other supplies provided by the school in good condition. Students will be charged for damaged or lost material.
