Objectives:	This course is designed to provide students with the skills and knowledge necessary to compete in the 21st century. Students need to be able to collaborate with others to complete a task, to make meaning of any text they encounter, and to communicate effectively in speech and writing. It also provides students ample opportunity to refine and master strategies that will enhance their ability to understand and analyze any challenging text, to write with clarity and voice, to speak and listen in order to communicate and work effectively with others, and to view media with a critical intelligence.

Class Work and Homework Policy:

- Students must complete and turn in assignments in a timely manner. Students should note assignments and due dates on their syllabus and in their agendas.
- In order to receive full credit for class participation, students must actively participate in class (ask questions if one does not understand, volunteer to answer questions, and become involved in class discussions).
- If a student is assigned to a group, the student must contribute to the group by completing his/her portion of the work and collaborating with the other group members to complete the assigned task.
- Handwritten assignments must be legible and submitted with the proper heading in the upper right hand corner of the full sheet of ruled paper.
- Typed assignments must be double-spaced, in Times New Roman, and 12 point font, justified with 1- inch margins.

Assessments: Announced and unannounced assessments will be given each at the end of each concept/theme, collection, and marking quarter.

Assignments: Assignments will coincide with the following thematic units:

- Collection 1: Coming to America
- Collection 2: Building a Democracy
- Collection 3: The Individual and Society
- Collection 6: The Modern World

Late Work: Late assignment(s) will earn reduced or no credit at the discretion of the instructor.

Weighting of Assignments: The final course grade will be based on various traditional and alternative assignments.
