<p>Class Work and Homework Policy:</p>	<p>Students are expected to keep up with the material by <i>reading at home</i>. Homework is given <i>often</i> and usually consists of section assessments.</p> <p>Due dates are announced in class and noted in Pinnacle gradebook. 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Quizzes:	Quizzes are given regularly and include new material as well as material from the past. At the end of the school year, students will be taking a state mandated EOC exam . The exam is cumulative , so retaining information is necessary.
Tests:	<p>A test will be given after every quiz (or sooner if it is a short chapter). Tests will be announced in class and on Pinnacle gradebook.</p> <p>Tests are mostly multiple choice but may also be fill in the blank, free response, etc.</p>
Late Work:	<p>If a student is absent, he/she may turn in late work up to 48 school hours after returning to school. After 48 hours, it will NOT be accepted.</p> <p>It is the student's responsibility to ask for late work and to check <i>pinnacle</i> and <i>showbie.com</i> regularly to see what he/she has missed.</p> <p>If a student is absent on the day of an exam (quiz/test), the student has 48 hours to make up that exam. <i>Exams can be made up immediately after school in my classroom.</i></p>
