Students will build a repertoire of useful reading, writing, speaking, and listening strategies. Students will strengthen their research, analytical, and critical thinking skills. Students will study diverse genres of literature and informational text in a variety of formats in order to gain insight and understanding to literature and how it affects society. Students will apply the writing process through a variety of finished products such as Argumentative Essays, and Character Analyses.

Assignments:

Assignments will coincide with the following thematic units (but will not be limited to):

- Gender Roles
- Voices of Protest
- Seeking Justice, Seeking Peace
- Finding Ourselves in Nature

Students will explore a diverse section of plays and novels, spanning from the 1500s to current day literature in order to gain an understanding of societies, cultural norms and more.

Assignments will be given to class in conjunction with the instructor's lessons and may or may not include:

Vocabulary
Writing prompts
Independent reading
Tests & Quizzes
Small projects

Quizzes:

Quizzes will be scheduled to monitor student progress throughout the semester. All scheduled quizzes will be announced up to one week in advance. There may also be unannounced quizzes given throughout the semester.

Tests:

Assessments will be administered at the end of each selection and/or major unit of study. Students will be notified a minimum of one week in advance.

Classwork/Homework and Late Work Policy:

Students are expected to review and adhere to Policy 6000.1-Student Progression Plan in the Student Code of Conduct.

Classwork and Homework is due on the date assigned by the teacher, at the **beginning** of class. Work that is not handed in at the **beginning** of class will be considered *late*. If you are found to be working on an assignment during class that was due at the

beginning of that class period, it's acceptance is solely at the discretion of the instructor. Late work will not be accepted for full credit. Papers turned in without a name will be disposed of, so make sure all work is labeled clearly with your name.

Classwork and homework must be completed in blue or black ink or pencil. Work written in red, purple, pink, or other colors that are not the above mentioned will not be accepted.

Binder checks may be conducted periodically, and may be unannounced.

Students who are absent are required to inquire about and complete any missed classwork and assignments. It is not the teacher's responsibility to seek the student for missed work.

Students with excused absences are allowed two days to complete work assigned that day for full credit. If the assignment has already been reviewed and passed back, and the student has exceeded his or her two days, the assignment will not be eligible for full credit and may not be accepted at all as per the instructor.

Students absent on a day an assignment is due **MUST** submit all work immediately upon return. It is the students' responsibility to find out about work that they missed so it can be completed.
