The AP English Language and Composition course aligns to an introductory <u>college-level rhetoric and</u> <u>writing curriculum</u>, which requires students to develop evidence-based analytic and argumentative essays that proceed through several stages or drafts. Students evaluate, synthesize, and cite research to support their arguments. Throughout the course, students develop a personal style by making appropriate grammatical choices. Additionally, students read and analyze the rhetorical elements and their effects in non-fiction texts, including graphic images as forms of text, from many disciplines and historical periods (www.apcentral.collegeboard.com).
