STEM-azing Stuff

Happy December! Our first Family STEM Night of this year was a great success, and I hope that those of you that were able to come out truly enjoyed the evening. If you borrowed any items from the Title 1 Resource Van, please be sure to drop them off in the office before winter break. During this month, PLE students are learning various science concepts, such as the different forms of energy and how these energies simply change forms as they can not be created or destroyed, force and motion, weather, and even the components of soil. Hands on collaborative learning is in full force, as students have become familiar with the new science materials and continue to engage in scientific inquiry with classroom labs and demonstrations.

Although snow and ice are not part of winter here in South Florida, for those of you who travel over the break, I'm sure you will encounter your fair share of these wintry conditions. Icy roads are a huge problem and many states use salt trucks during the winter. Do you know why??? Salt and ice react chemically to help melt the ice. Salt also reduces the freezing temperature of water, making it colder than just the ice alone. You can use this principle for a fun and delicious STEM activity and make your own ice cream! All you need is milk, sugar, any toppings you like, 2 zip lock bags, salt and ice.

Fill a small plastic bag with 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 tbsp. vanilla and 1 tbsp. sugar. Next, half fill a large plastic bag with ice. Have you child pour 6 tbsp. of salt over their ice then place the small bag in the large bag. (Rock salt works best.) Have them seal their large bag and start shaking for 5 to 10 minutes. They will be able to see through the clear bag what the salt does to the ice, and how their ice cream is made. Experiment with different ingredients and enjoy!

As the holiday season gets closer and kids are home from school, it's easy to get busy in all the preparation and forget to keep kids on a regular reading schedule. Here are some ideas to keep your children reading over the holiday break.

- Have your kids read holiday cards when they are received in the mail and let them write a message in outgoing cards.
- Write and read thank you notes.
- Let kids read ingredients from holiday recipes while you bake together. It's a great way for them to learn measurements and temperatures.
- Set aside time for kids to "show off" their new reading skills to visiting family. Children love being the focus of attention, and grandparents and other family members are usually more than willing to see their progress.
- Make special holiday readings a tradition. Find a special book for the holidays and have each member of the family read from it at the same time each year.
- Even if no books make your child's wish list, make sure you give at least one as a gift, and encourage them to read it.
- Have kids read to their siblings, cousins, friends, or to any other children they socialize with over the holidays.
- Find books that focus on an interest your child has. There are books out there for every interest, it just takes a little searching.
