# A Message From Our Principal

As you and your families are gearing up for the approaching holidays, we too are preparing for a very busy December at PLE! Please make note of the days, times and information within this newsletter for our Field Days, PTA Holiday Store, and Winter Show. We hope to see you at many of these exciting school traditions!

At Pines Lakes Elementary, we provided targeted instruction to all children using the Florida Standards as our framework. To ensure that our students are provided the enrichment and interventions they require to be successful, we have developed mini-assessments in reading, math, and science for students in grades 2-5. Every four weeks, PLE students show what they know! Our teachers use data from these assessments to provide students with targeted remediation or enrichment. We will be recognizing students who are working hard and demonstrate proficiency with a special event during the school day. Students who score 70% or greater on any of the three subject areas will be acknowledged as a "Smart Cookie" and receive a special treat. For each score of 70% and higher, students will receive one entry into our year end giveaway! Additionally, students in kindergarten through fifth grade are expected to complete i-Ready lessons weekly. Recommended usage is 45 minutes per subject (reading & math), with an expected pass rate of 70%. The class with the most number of i-Ready lessons passed will receive a pizza party. The top 3 students each month will receive a chance to "PIE" the Principal & Assistant Principal at the end of the year. Please look for the flyer coming home with your child. We are excited to recognize the hard work of our students and hope you can find time to discuss with your child and reinforce their hard work. With so much happening at our school this month, I am sure our paths will cross for me to wish you a Happy Holiday in person. But in case I don't see some of you, I'll pass along my wishes now for a STEMazing holiday season! Thank you for sharing your "gifts" with me - your PAWsome children! # STEM-azing Stuff

#### Greetings PLE Families,

Happy December! Our first Family STEM Night of this year was a great success, and I hope that those of you that were able to come out truly enjoyed the Star-studded evening. The flyer for our Winter Break STEM challenge will be sent home soon and I hope to see many families participating in this fun activity!

Although snow and ice are not part of winter here in South Florida, for those of you that travel over the break, I'm sure you will encounter your fair share of these wintry conditions. Icy roads are a huge problem and many states use salt trucks during the winter. Do you know why??? Salt and ice react chemically to help melt the ice. Salt also reduces the freezing temperature of water, making it colder than just the ice alone. You can use this principle for a fun and delicious STEM activity and make your own ice cream! All you need is milk, sugar, any toppings you like, 2 zip lock bags, salt and ice.

Fill a small plastic bag with 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 tbsp. vanilla and 1 tbsp. sugar. Next, half fill a large plastic bag with ice. Have you child pour 6 tbsp. of salt over their ice then place the small bag in the large bag. (Rock salt works best.) Have them seal their large bag and start shaking for 5 to 10 minutes. They will be able to see through the clear bag what the salt does to the ice, and how their ice cream is made. Experiment with different ingredients and enjoy!

#### Give the Gift of Reading This Holiday Season

Reading with your child and encouraging your older children to read are among the most important things you can do as a parent because you will be providing your children with the opportunity to become better and more confident readers as they grow. If your family is bilingual, books in your first language or bilingual books are great options for your children - research shows that strong reading skills in a child's first language will allow them to become stronger readers in their second language.

#### **Book Recommendations**

Good books are wonderful gifts! Young children can enjoy the magic of a book's story and illustrations again and again, and when they read with you they will practice their reading skills and learn something new. What about e-books? It's tempting to let the device do the work read the story, play a game and interact with your child, but there's no substitute for quality parent-child conversation.

Finding and Sharing Great Kids' Books: Here's some advice about how to find a good children's book and what to do once you're reading together. What to look for: Look for award-winning books. Each year the American Library Association selects children's books for the Caldecott Medal for illustrations and the Newbery Medal for writing. Check the book review section of newspapers and magazines for the recommended new children's books.

Remember: There are many ways to gather books and share a love of reading with a child. Borrowing books from your local public library and swapping favorites with neighbors are good ways to learn about new books.

What to do: It's important to read to your child, but it's also important to listen to them read. Your support and encouragement helps them develop their skills. Listen carefully as your child reads. Take turns. Read a paragraph (or page) and have your child read the next one. Tell your child how proud you are of his or her efforts and skills. If your child has trouble reading a word, you can help in several ways: Guide him/her to use what they know about letters and sounds to sound out the word. Ask him/her to skip over the word, read the rest of the sentence, and then say a word that would make sense in the story. Supply the correct word.

Remember: Your child may be focusing more on how to read each word than on what they mean, so your reading helps to keep the story alive.
