I hope that students are thirsty for all the new knowledge that will be coming their way as this quarter begins. Through their continuous exposure to STEM education throughout the curriculum, our students will be called upon to use higher order thinking skills and be problem solvers . Project based learning in STEM provides our teachers the opportunity for students to collaborate, explore, and experiment. Elementary aged students are curious and inquisitive by nature, and research shows that students exposed to STEM education at a young age will be much better prepared as they progress from one grade level to the next. A critical component of STEM education comes from asking questions. Providing students with the answers right away does not allow them the chance for critical thinking. They must be given time for a "productive struggle" and come up with a solution. When your child asks a question, ask some follow up question in return. Taking the time to ask your child these deeper questions will show you what they have learned and identify areas that may need a bit more focus. If our students are able to identify the "why" behind the "what, then we as educators and parents know that they are on the track.

Waking Up From Holiday Break: How To Get Your Kids Ready For School After the Holidays

From all of us at Pines Lakes Elementary, Happy 2019 Panthers! We're excited for a new year of more learning adventures. We know that getting into the swing of things after the holidays can be tricky, especially since the months between winter and spring breaks are crucial to end the school year

Unplug and Get a Good Night's Sleep

Much like summer, winter break brings less restrictions on TV, computer and video games. It's easy for kids to become night owls when they know they can sleep in the next morning. Both of these habits can make the first week back to school challenging, even for the most motivated student. Before sending them back to regular routines, lessen screen time and ease back to a reasonable bedtime.

Remember Breakfast

Healthy, filling breakfasts are one of the most important factors in a child's ability to focus in class. If they arrive to school hungry. they will likely be sluggish and distracted from the get-go. If the breakfast they did eat consisted of sugary cereal or doughnuts, they will often experience an energy decline an hour into the day. Start the day off right with a nutritious and filling breakfast, such as oatmeal or toast with peanut butter.

Get Organized

Take inventory of your child's school supplies. Do they need refills on paper or pencils? Are folders exploding with old papers? Does their backpack have wrappers crumpled at the bottom? Help them return to school with pencils sharpened and folders organized. Teachers will thank you!

and not just with your child. Get back into the habit of reading the notes that come home from school. Take the time each day to check for letters and flyers from the school. This will make it much easier for everyone when the time comes for permission slips to be turned in or conferences to be scheduled.

Check In

You may have had a parent-teacher conference just before the holiday season. If not, take a moment this month to check in with the teacher about your child's progress, especially if you have concerns. It is still early enough in the year to work on behavior or skills that may be holding your child back from reaching their full potential.

Back to Homework

Just like at the start of the year, your child will have to get back into the habit of regular homework. So will you. Decide if what you were doing in the fall was the best schedule for fitting in homework, and reorganize it if necessary.
