Hello Panthers!

As a reminder...The State of Florida has initiated a new traffic law for ALL school zones and work zones. NO HANDHELD CELL PHONES/DEVICES IN SCHOOL ZONES, WORK/CONSTRUCTION ZONES.

Basically, "a person may not operate a motor vehicle while using a wireless communications device in a handheld manner in a designated school crossing, school zone, or work zone area. A motor vehicle that is stationary is not being operated and is not subject to the prohibition in this paragraph." THIS LAW INCLUDES OUR CAR LOOPS. For additional details on this new traffic law, you can search for Florida Statute 316.306 (3)(a)1. Please do not take offense when I, or another officer warns you or issues a citation. Working with your child on STEM activities will continue to strengthen their problem-solving skills and is a wonderful way to connect with your child. Ready, Set, Go! Tips for Returning to School After a Holiday Break

It can be hard for students to get back in gear after a school

holiday.

Coming back from holiday break can be a challenge for all students. Travel, late nights, sleeping in, and visits with family and friends can throw off a student's normal routine.

As a parent, there are a few things you can do to help your children get back in the groove after an extended break. It may seem impossible to get grumpy kids out of bed early and off to school. After school, you may feel overwhelmed trying to get your child to focus on his or her homework.

Getting adequate sleep

School breaks create a big shift in sleeping patterns. Parents may loosen the rules about bedtimes, TV, video games and screen time.

It is easy for students to get out of a good sleeping routine. Staying up late and sleeping in becomes the norm, and the first early week of school is a rude awakening.

This can really make the school day challenging because sleep deprivation makes it very difficult for students to focus during class.

You can help solve this problem by easing back to a normal bedtime routine a day or two before school starts. Limit screen time and enforce a decent bedtime - your child may not understand, but you will be glad he or she got the extra sleep on the first day back to school.

Stick to a routine

Students of all ages tend to better on a consistent schedule. This is because there is an established pattern, and the student will know what to expect out of each day.

Just because school is out for a break does not mean you should completely give up on maintaining a routine.

A regular schedule, combined with a good night's sleep, will help your child to physically and mentally keep up with the demands of going back to school.

Check-in

The last tip is to check-in with your child's teachers. Take a moment during your day to send a quick text or email. This way, if there are any concerns about your child's academic performance or attentiveness, you can establish an action plan with the teacher. Do not wait until the next parent-teacher conference to address these issues. After the holiday break marks half of the school year. This is an important time as teachers and students are preparing for end-of-year performance tasks and assessments.

It is important to check your child's agenda and folder on a regular basis to be aware of important communication going home. In addition, please update your contact information with the school to make sure you are receiving weekly updates via telephone and email.
