DISCIPLINE CORNER

DID YOU KNOW that projectile devices such as BB guns, hard pellet guns, and paint ball guns are Class B Weapons? Possession of any of these on campus could result in an external suspension of up to nine days for the first offense. A second offense warrants a recommendation for expulsion.

DID YOU KNOW.....

- a) <u>All</u> rules that apply to the school grounds and school activities also apply to the school bus. Parents are responsible for their student's behavior on the way to and from school and at the bus stop.
- b) Boarding or attempting to board a bus route other than the student's assigned bus route, or attempting to leave the school bus at other than the student's assigned bus stop without permission of the school principal or designee is a Level 3 Violation, which could result in a 1-day to 10-day suspension from the school bus.

Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) is committed to supporting students, families, and staff optimize their personal well-being and overall mental health.

While mental illness impacts 1 in 5 US adults each year, these illnesses are highly treatable, yet recognizing mental health disorders in our youth is especially important since:

- 1 in 6 U.S. youth aged 6-17 experience a mental health disorder each year
- 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14, and 75% by age 24
- Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among people aged 10-34 Source: National Alliance on Mental Illness

BCPS observes Mental Health Awareness Month every May. Each year millions of Americans face the reality of living with a mental health illness. More than 1 in 5 Americans will be affected by a mental health condition in their lifetime and every American is affected or impacted through their friends and family.


