## School Hours

Our school day starts at 8:00 A.M. and ends at 2:00 P.M. Please have your children arrive to school prior to 7:55 A.M. this will ensure they are in their seats by 8:00 A.M. and ready to learn. We offer morning care at 6:45 A.M. and we start serving breakfast as early as 7:30 A.M. Reminder - Per Fla. State Section 1003.31 (2): Please do not drop off students prior to 7:30 A.M., as there is no supervision.

Attendance Florida Statute 1003.21 states that all children between the ages of 6 to 16 are required to attend school regularly during the entire school year. Statute 1003.24 states that parents are responsible for the school attendance of their children. Parents, if your child is going to be absent, please call the attendance hotline (754) 322-8152 to report the absence. Parents are responsible for their child's regular attendance. To report an absence, visit our website under CONTACT, then select REPORT AN ABSENCE to submit an electronic form, call the attendance hotline, or deliver a note to our staff. Our goal is to have ALL students that are able to attend more than 95% of school days. Students that are absent 5% or more days may require parental interventions from school staff. Truancy notifications may lead to more severe penalties. Absences impact the teaching and learning for all students in the classroom. If your child must be absent for an excusable reason, please report the absence within 24 hrs. Our attendance clerk will update all absences that are reported and meet one of the reasons in the attendance policy.

### **Unified Dress Code**

## Safety and Security Updates

Maintaining a safe and secure campus is our priority. Per District protocol all perimeter gates will remain locked and manned when opened. All classroom doors and buildings also will always remain locked. A campus monitor conducts campus walkthroughs to ensure campus security.

### **Kindergarten**

We have been having a fabulous first few weeks of school. We are becoming more comfortable and independent at school every day! In the first quarter, we will be very busy learning all about rules (green and red choices), making friends, being a good citizen, about ourselves and families, and five senses. Also, we are practicing and learning all about the expectations and procedures of literacy and math centers. In math, we will enjoy learning about numbers 0 to 5. In October, we will be starting reading. Once in full swing, your child should be bringing home a leveled reader book to practice their reading skills. At home, you should be practicing identifying concepts of print, discussing story elements, and asking your child to give you reasons why it was a good book or not. Please make sure to return the leveled books. We are working on learning our letters and sounds and will be starting to learn sight words. Thank you for all the support and helping to make the transition to kindergarten a successful one.

## 2nd Grade

Welcome back to school! In second grade, we have been working on establishing classroom routines using our new English/Language Arts curriculum, Benchmark Advance. We are excited to be starting our first integrated unit on habitats in September. In Math, we will be working on addition and subtraction strategies. Using flash cards is a great way to learn basic facts and build fact fluency! As always, your child should be reading at home daily for at least 20 minutes. Asking your child to retell what they have read or asking questions about their book builds their comprehension! Students will also be using I-Ready Reading and Benchmark Universe while in class. We would like to encourage all parents to join us for Open House. We look forward to a year of promoting academic excellence for all our second graders!

#### 3rd Grade

We are off to building a great 3rd grade year! We are focusing on the well-being of students and establishing routines. We have completed our first i-Ready Diagnostic in both Reading and Math and are hard at work on our individual learning paths. In Reading, we are finding a right fit book and working on building our reading stamina. In Writing, third graders are learning to use good writing skills and using text evidence to support their writing. As always, your child should be reading at home daily for at least 20 minutes. Asking your child to retell what they have read or asking questions about their book will help build their comprehension! In math, we are working on estimation and rounding, along with reviewing addition and subtraction. It's never too early to start learning multiplication facts! Our goal this year is to have all students fluent in multiplication and division facts through the 12's. We start off with easier multiples of 1,2,5,10, and then move on to the more challenging factors. Using flash cards is a great way to learn the facts and build fact fluency! We look forward to a year of promoting academic excellence for all our students! Third graders are on the road to SUCCESS!

Welcome Back To School!!!

Pre-K is so happy to welcome back our families to face to face learning. This month we will be working on learning the school routine, keeping our masks on, washing our hands often, and staying in our own space. We will work on the letters N, W, P, H, and M. We will also complete our In School Unit and begin to work on an All About Me unit.

# 1<sup>st</sup> Grade

Welcome to First Grade! As we all begin the new school year, first grade will be focusing on our school theme of "Building Back Better". We will focus on rules and how to be responsible citizens in Social Studies. We can be responsible citizens in school, at home, and in the community. We are learning the difference between rules/laws and why they are important. We have been practicing using Good Character Traits and learning the roles of a Leader.

Science is all about matter. We will be engaging students through hands-on activities that encourage discussions on the properties of matter (texture, size, shape, color, weight, and height.

In Math we are counting and adding. We are using math terms like addend, sum, equals, combine, and plus. We will also be learning how to use math talk while learning. Using math vocabulary while we talk helps us learn the math words that we will see throughout the year. We are also learning that you get the same sum regardless of the order of addends. (6+2=8, 2+6=8) and any number plus zero stays the same (0+3=3).

Reading and Writing are the glue that holds our entire curriculum together. We encourage families to practice reading and writing sight words regularly. The more sight words you know, the better reader you will become. We are working on asking and answering questions about a text and using our "partner talk" during learning. This month we will be focusing on the plot of a fiction book and what that includes. We will use story maps to show the characters, setting, problem, solution, and moral. We focus on identifying problem

## <u>4<sup>th</sup> Grade</u>

We are diving into learning in Fourth Grade! Everyone is so excited to back at school, and we are "Building Back Better" together! We have completed our first I-Ready Diagnostic in Reading and Math and are hard at work on our individual learning paths. In Reading, we are working through our awesome new curriculum called Benchmark Advance. Reading nightly at home for 20 to 30 minutes will really help us become better readers! In Language Arts, Fourth Graders are working on becoming good writers by knowing how and when to use correct capitalization and punctuation, and we are beginning to learn to write main idea paragraphs with text evidence. In Math, students are finding place value, working problems in addition and subtraction to 1,000,000, rounding whole numbers, and getting ready to multiply tens, hundreds, and thousands by 1-digit numbers. Practicing our multiplication facts (1 through 12) daily at home will help us become great math students! In Science, learning about the study of the natural world and how scientists work is fascinating. Students are now receiving nightly homework assignments during the week in both Reading and Math. We are looking forward to a fun and fabulous Fourth Grade year with hard working students who love learning!

## 5<sup>th</sup> Grade

We are off to an amazing start this year. We have taken much-needed time to get back into the swing of things on campus full time. What a great feeling it is to be back!

Assessments in both reading and math will begin soon. Students will be completing their i-Ready Reading and Math diagnostics. We will do our best to complete these assessments as quickly as possible in order to move forward with instruction. Remind your child to do their best when completing these assessments.

Math: In class, students are currently working on fluency with whole numbers and decimals. Students will be diving deeper into place value, decimals, multiplication, and division. It is always good to have your child practice their multiplication facts at home. This can be done by using or creating flashcards.

Reading: Our focus for the next few weeks will incorporate determining the author's purpose, making predictions, and making connections to the text that we read. Please be sure your child is reading 30 minutes each night.

Science: Science is off to an exciting start. Students are working on understanding different adaptations that animals and all living things make in order to survive. Kudos to Mr. Brown, Academic Support – Math and Science, for pushing in supporting 5<sup>th</sup> graders.

The 2021-2022 school is going to be an incredible year full of lots of learning! Let's build our skills and take fifth grade to the top!

#### E.S.E. Specialist

Dear Ram Fam, are you familiar with Broward County's EdPlan connect feature? EdPlan Connect allows parents and guardians to access students' IEP documents whenever a final IEP document is created for a student in EdPlan. Please reference the following directions as a guide for navigating this feature. When a final IEP document is created, an automated email invitation with a link to access the parent portal is sent out. After clicking on the link in the email you will be taken to the EdPlan Connect parent portal to authenticate your identity by requesting and using an Access Code. You can choose to receive the access code by text message, voice call, or email. When you select one of the three methods for receiving the access code, you will then click the "Request Access Code" button. Once you receive the Access Code email, you will then copy the Access Code and paste it into the Parent Portal Login page. Be careful not to leave any blank spaces after the code. Next, click the green Login button which will take you to the To-Do List page. The To-Do List is where any documents awaiting review are displayed. From here you can click on the blue IEP document link to review the document. ## Literacy Coach

Students will be taking the first i-Ready Reading and Math Diagnostic within the next few weeks. This will assessment help create a personalized learning path for each student. The *i*-*Ready Diagnostic* is a type of computer adaptive test that matches the difficulty of test questions to the ability of each student. As students answer questions correctly, the test becomes more difficult. As students answer questions incorrectly, the test becomes easier. In both scenarios, the test adapts to find the precise ability of each student in the quickest, most efficient way possible. Once a student completes a Diagnostic assessment, *i-Ready* will use the new data to determine the student's domain-specific online personalized lesson path or if the current path needs to be adjusted. Students are then able work on their personalized lesson path. i-Ready Personalized Instruction is a powerful tool that supports your teaching and provides instruction targeted to every student's strengths and needs. It is our school goal for each student in Kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade to complete 30 minutes of i-Ready practice each week. For 3rd,  $4^{th}$ , and  $5^{th}$  grade students, the goal is 45 minutes a week. We will be tracking students' progress and celebrating success!
