Summer VPK

WHO: Children entering Kindergarten in August 2021 who did not use their 2020-2021 VPK Certificate or have utilized less than 70% (378 hours) of their 2020-2021 VPK Certificate (a re-enrollment VPK Certificate is required to use this option).

WHEN: June 21, 2021 – August 3, 2021, Monday – Thursday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday – Thursday. Times may vary.

WHERE: 13 BCPS Locations.

HOW: Families must obtain the child's 2020-2021 VPK Certificate of Eligibility or 2020-2021 VPK Re- Enrollment Certificate of Eligibility through the State Family Portal and apply for a school through the BCPS VPK Parent Portal. Head Start 3-Year Olds

WHO: Children currently enrolled in a Head Start 3-year old classroom.

WHERE: Select Broward County Public Schools with 3-year old Head Start classrooms.

HOW: Current Head Start 3-year old families will be contacted by the Head Start team to share information and opportunities to participate.

WHEN: June 21, 2021 – July 29, 2021, Monday – Thursday, four hours daily. Times vary by site.



Pre-K ESE

WHO: Pre-K Students with disabilities currently in the Pre-K ESE program within Broward County Public Schools.

WHERE: Students will attend their Pre-K ESE assigned school or the site their home school feeds into.

HOW: Families should register through the Summer Program link on current school website.

WHERE: 56 BCPS Host Schools and their identified feeder schools.

WHO: Current BCPS School Year 2020-2021 Pre-K students who are entering Kindergarten in Fall 2021 (five years old by September 1, 2021) and are not participating in other BCPS Summer Pre-K Programs (Summer VPK, Pre-K ESE).

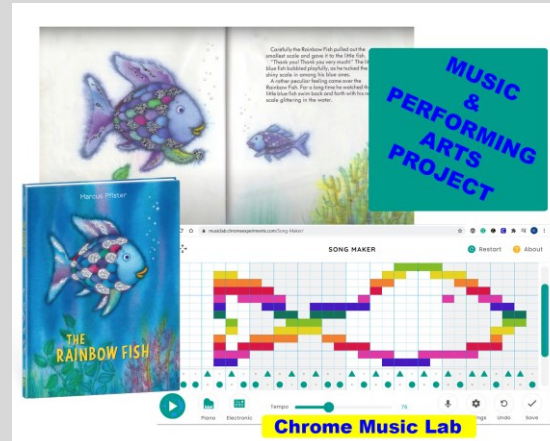

“Life Below Water” with Applied Learning

Students will discover “Life Below Water” through the book *The Rainbow Fish* and by creating original songs.



Students will learn about environmental art focused on life below the water and make their own aquatic paper collage.

Students will propose and debate potential solutions to microplastics affecting life below (and above) water.



Students will apply design thinking to solve problems affecting life in both fresh water and salt water ecosystems.

Summer Learning Experiences for Students with Disabilities



- Students will receive support from an ESE Teacher or Support Facilitator, as needed.
- Students' accommodations will be provided in order to have access to the curriculum.
- Secondary students will enroll in credit recovery courses, as needed, and enrichment/elective courses.
- Additional support will be provided as needed by school and district staff.

Program 3: Extended School Year 2021



- Extended School Year (ESY) is offered to SWDs as part of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
- Eligibility for ESY is an IEP committee decision and must be documented on the IEP annually.
- SWDs receive services based on their IEP and instruction focuses on specific IEP goals.
- ESY services may include academic instruction, related services, OT/PT/SLP services, behavior support, transition services and other services as highlighted by the IEP team.¹⁷

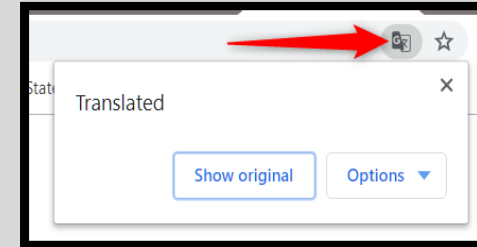
Program 3: Extended School Year 2021

- "By the Sea" Unique Learning System for students on ACCESS points.
- 4 hours of daily in-person instruction and services focusing on IEP Goals through a Canvas course platform.
- Provision of related services such as Speech and Language, OT, PT, nursing, counseling and behavior support.
- On the job support for students in deferment programs at select high schools and technical colleges.
- In home support and services are available for our students enrolled in hospital homebound.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)



Face Coverings – REQUIRED (Mask Policy Remains in Effect)

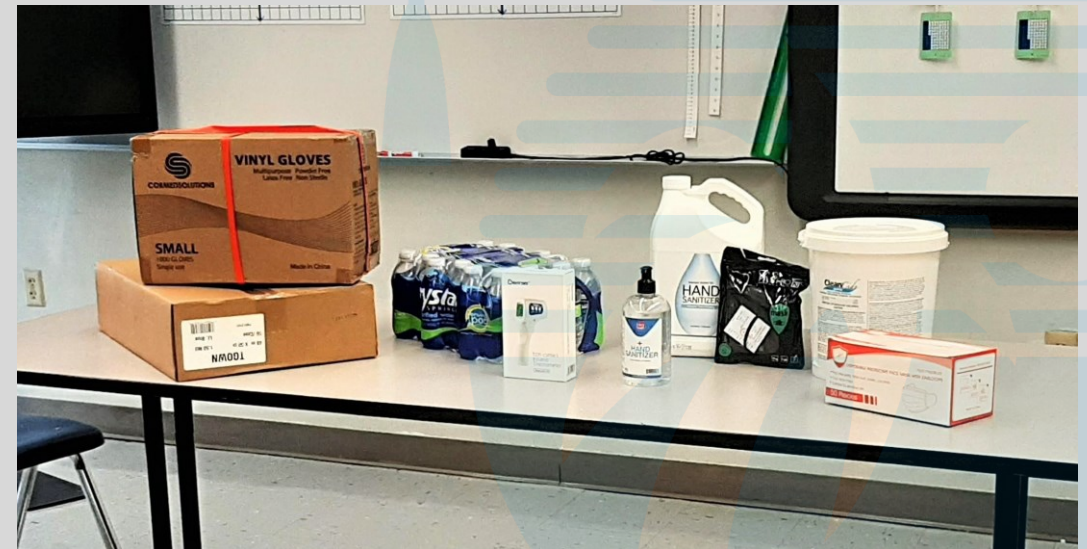
Students and staff are required to wear face coverings **AT ALL TIMES** while in District buildings. Parents must provide face coverings for their child each day. If a student loses or damages their face covering during the school day, a disposable mask will be provided. This is in accordance with the District's Face Covering Policy.

All BCPS classrooms have been stocked with necessary items to protect students and staff against COVID-19. The following items are available for staff and/or student use:

- Hand sanitizer
- Gloves
- 3-ply face coverings
- Disinfecting wipes

Specialized PPE for staff who work with special needs students has been provided:

- Reusable face shields
- Protective gowns
- Clear communicator masks
- Portable clear barriers



School Security and Physical Distancing



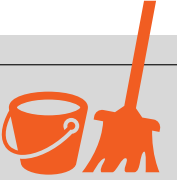
School Security

- A Safe School Officer will be present at every school
- School-based Security staff will also be on campus

Physical Distancing

- 3 feet or greater should be adhered to where possible (6 feet is preferred)

Cleaning Procedures



Daily Electrostatic Spraying

All BCPS Facilities are equipped with Electrostatic Sprayers. Facilities Service Persons perform daily electrostatic spraying in high traffic areas including: Restrooms, Front office(s), Cafeteria, Media Center, Clinic, Isolation Room, Gymnasium, Locker rooms, Weight rooms, student entries, single-point of entry, etc.

Increased Routine Cleaning

All BCPS Facility Service Persons are trained on effective methods for cleaning and disinfecting schools to help fight the spread of viruses and other harmful bacteria. Facilities Service Persons check common areas throughout the day to conduct touch-point cleaning and do thorough cleaning/disinfecting once students leave for the day.

Emergency Cleaning

In the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19 in a BCPS facility, the facility will temporarily close to allow for emergency cleaning. A third-party service has been retained to assist with this cleaning as needed.

Classroom Cleaning Supplies

All classrooms have been supplied CleanCide/Lysol disinfecting wipes to allow for additional intermittent cleaning as needed or desired.
