FAFSA Step-by-Step

STEP 1: Create an FSA ID

Go to https://fsaid.ed.gov/ and create an FSA ID

• student must have one and one parent must have their OWN FSA ID. The parent FSA ID has to be created with a *different* email address from the student's email address.

• At the end, it will send a "secure code" to your email address. You will have to go to your email, get the code and enter it into the FSA website. This is the last step in creating your FSA ID.

STEP 2: Fill out the FAFSA

Go to <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>

Click "Start a new FAFSA"

- Two options:
 - o 2019-2020 FAFSA for students starting college SUMMER 2020

- students starting in summer must do **<u>BOTH</u>** the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 FAFSA

o 2020-2021 FAFSA for students going to college in Fall/August 2020

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

- If you select male, you MUST select "yes" to register with the selective service
- What will your grade level be when you begin the 2019-2020 school year?
 - ANSWER: Never attended college/1st. Yr.

SCHOOL SELECTION

• Choose up to 10 schools. You will be able to add schools/change your selections at a later date if you need to by logging back in and choosing "add a school"

DEPENDENCY STATUS

Determines whether or not the student will need to report parent information

- If the student is DEPENDENT = WILL have to report parent information
- If the student is INDEPENDENT = will NOT have to report parent information

Never Married	The parent that you lived with most during the last 12 months. Remarried (after being widowed or divorced)	Parent and stepparent
Divorced or Separated	The parent that you lived with most during the last 12 months. Widowed	Your parent

PARENT FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Linking to the IRS Data Retrieval Tool:

- Use the **PARENT FSA ID** to link to their taxes
- Make sure "filing status" and the address match up EXACTLY as they were reported on the taxes in order for it to transfer successfully
 - If you cannot link to the IRS Data Retrieval tool, use 2018 tax return (form 1040, 1040A, or 1040EZ) to complete this section



- For any question, if the answer is "0," answer "0"



FAFSA PARENTS

If your parents are married or live together, fill out information for both.





If you lived with one parent more than the other, over the last 12 months, fill out information for the parent you lived with more.

Report information on the parent who has provided more financial support to you over the last 12 months.



Your grandparents, widowed stepparents, foster parents, legal guardians, older brothers and sisters, or uncles and aunts are not your parents on the FAFSA unless they have legally adopted you.

TO MAKE FILLING OUT YOUR FINANCIAL INFORMATION FOR FAFSA EASIER, USE THE IRS DATA RETRIEVAL TOOL.

IN THE FINANCES SECTION OF THE ONLINE FORM, YOU WILL SEE A "LINK TO IRS" BUTTON IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO USE THE IRS DRT.

> CLICK THE "LINK TO IRS" BUTTON AND LOG IN WITH YOUR FSA ID TO BE TRANSFERRED TO THE IRS TO RETRIEVE YOUR INFO.

ONCE AT THE IRS SITE, ENTER YOUR INFORMATION EXACTLY AS IT APPEARS ON YOUR FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN AND CLICK THE "SUBMIT" BUTTON.



CHECK THE "TRANSFER MY TAX INFORMATION INTO THE FAFSA FORM" BOX, AND CLICK THE "TRANSFER NOW" BUTTON.

RECORDS OF UNTAXED INCOME (E.G. VETERANS BENEFITS)
