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EdTalk Introduction

Ed Talk 2012

In September of 2012, Broward County Public Schools hosted the first annual Ed Talk public forum to obtain input from all stakeholders on the development and implementation of the District's Strategic Plan.

The goals of Ed Talk 2012 were to:

•Bring a diverse cross-section of the community together to share the vision, mission and values of Broward County Public Schools in order to drive the development of the District's Strategic Plan.

• Actively engage community members in a discussion of the needs of Broward County Public Schools and using those needs to create specific priorities to further develop the District's Strategic Plan.

• Identify a clear direction for continuing to develop and implement the District's Strategic Plan. Encourage a sense of ownership of the District's Strategic Plan and commitment to its goals among involved community members.

More than 400 community members attended Ed Talk 2012 including parents, students, elected officials, and representatives of business, higher education, community organizations and faith-based institutions.

During this 2½- hour forum, participants were given a series of discussion points to address different components of the Strategic Plan. Small groups of 10 participants per table were guided by a facilitator, which allowed for optimum collaboration. The use of keypads after each discussion made it possible to capture, summarize and immediately share responses with all attendees.

The Ed Talk 2012 forum resulted in a finalized, three year Strategic Plan for the Broward County Public School System.

3. Expand community outreach and active participation by a wider range of individuals, businesses and organizations.


4. Leverage the momentum of the event to increase its impact.

Forum Structure Ed Talk 2013

Meetings were structured to allow for optimum collaboration among participants. Small groups of 10 participants were formed and paired with a facilitator to guide discussion and ensure all ideas were voiced. After each topic's discussion, participants were asked to reach table consensus, submit the "headline" captured on laptops, and then share their prioritized responses using a keypad. The use of keypads enabled the aggregation and summarization of participant feedback and allowed the lead facilitator to immediately share the room's results with attendees.





The first discussion session asked participants to ask themselves: "If you can imagine a successful college and career ready graduate, describe what you see in that student". Their responses to this question are graphed below.




Vote for what best describes a college and career ready graduate


Analysis Of Polling Results - Discussion Question #1

Polling Results by Gender


Polling Results by Age

The accountability system that BCPS is implementing "works for every student in every school."


Learning towards mastery provides a clearer picture of what individual students know and can do. Academic growth is achieved by maintaining or increasing the level of mastery.

- Students should at least Make Year's Growth in a Year's Time




3 Pillars of State Accountability







Polling Results by Gender


Polling Results by Race


The forum concluded with a series of forum evaluation questions that participants answered through keypad polling to give feedback on what they thought of quality of material and organization of the forum in general.








