District Support by Format and Program

How FTE Works in Focus

Districts are funded for the instruction they provide. Surveys are designated periods of time that districts report snapshots of the instruction being provided for funding. There are five FTE funded surveys each academic year. Surveys 2 and 3 fund the bulk of the instruction districts provide. Surveys 4 and 1 fund instruction outside of the standard 180-day school year. Survey 5 funds additional FTE for specific programs like Advanced Placement, Industry Certification, etc.

Per FLDOE, students must be enrolled, scheduled and in attendance to be eligible for FTE. Focus monitors these three criteria and automatically funds students for their total class minutes weekly (CMW). Focus also reviews demographics to apply the appropriate FEFP program to weight the funding associated with each course record. All records are reported with an FEFP program, although currently the student schedule only shows FEFP 130 and 300. One way to see all the FEFP associated with student records is to run **Florida Reports > Print FTE Detail**.

Students who are not present at least one time during the Attendance Membership window will have FEFP 999 (reported, unfunded) programmatically applied to course records. To track students trending toward defunding, a daily report will be sent to the School Folder on the portal page for those with an IMT or School Admin profile. The report will show students with consecutive absences for the whole attendance eligibility window.

After the close of business on date certain **Friday, October 11th**, the district will create an exact copy of all the data in Focus referred to as the **Survey Site**. This is comparable to External and contains the actual records that will be transmitted to the state. Changes to state reported data after date certain will need to be made in both Focus (production) and the Survey Site. Schools will have access to the survey site for a period of time to ensure final updates are made to their data. Comparison reports will also be disseminated to ensure the live data in Focus aligns with the reported Survey Site data.
