September 9, 2020, Special School Board Meeting Special Revenue - Grants Fund Amendment - Final As of June 30, 2020 Executive Summary

Special Revenue Grants Fund Amendment is submitted to the School Board pursuant to State Board Administrative Rule 6A-1.007. This Amendment is for the purpose of updating the Broward County School District Budget for estimated revenues and appropriation changes in the Special Revenue Grants Fund.

This amendment incorporates several important changes:

- 1. Head Start / Early Head Start award received an increase from Department of Health and Human Services. The additional funds will provide iPads with protective cases for students, teachers and assistants, storage charging stations, personal protective equipment for every Head Start / Early Head Start classroom which includes gloves, mask, face shields, hand sanitizer, non contact thermometers, Soar family backpack which includes 10 weeks of activities, ReadyRosie which is a family engagement virtual tool and employ summer staff to assist parents with the application and registration process.
- 2. Title IV Student Support & Academic Enrichment award received an increase from Florida Department of Education. The additional funds will provide 216 classroom teachers with diversity and equity professional development materials that correlates to the 4 state mandates: African American History, History of the Holocaust, Women's History and Hispanic contributions. Funds will also provide diversity and equity professional development to non-instructional staff at charter schools and private school.
