December 15, 2020, Regular School Board Meeting Special Revenue Grants Fund Amendment #1 As of October 31, 2020 Executive Summary

Special Revenue Grants Fund Amendment is submitted to the School Board pursuant to State Board Administrative Rule 6A-1.007. This Amendment is for the purpose of updating the Broward County School District Budget for estimated revenues and appropriation changes in the Special Revenue Grants Fund.

This amendment incorporates several important changes:

- 1. Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) new funding received from US Department of Justice will increase the safety and security of students and staff by replacing visitor and volunteer management systems at 268 locations throughout the district. Acceptance requirement: District will provide a cash match of \$166,666.
- 2. Head Start / Early Head Start award received an increase from Department of Health and Human Services. The additional funds will be used to create an action plan for Trauma Informed Care which provides support for children with behavioral concerns due to trauma in the home and/or disabilities. Funds will also provide professional development for Head Start and Early Head Start staff in the area of Trauma Informed Care.
- 3. CARES ACT GEER Building K-12 CTE Infrastructure new funding received from Florida Department of Education will purchase equipment and build infrastructure that will accelerate Career Technical Education (CTE) students readiness for the workplace and/or immediate entry into a high demand secondary CTE program. Acceptance requirement: District will provide a cash match of \$158,093.
- 4. AmeriCorps new funding received from Volunteer Florida will support a pilot program where 21 AmeriCorps members will be assigned to seven secondary schools. The program will provide academic tutoring, lead school-based mindfulness initiatives and assist with organizing Broward's Day of Service and Love at schools across the district. Participating schools are Olsen Middle, West Glades Middle, Boyd Anderson High, Deerfield Beach High, Miramar High, Northeast High and South Plantation High
- 5. Dolphins Digital new funding received from Miami Dolphins Foundation will provide laptops for remote and face-to-face learning for students at elementary schools identified with the highest needs. The elementary schools are Bethune, Broadview, Castle Hill, Charles Drew, Colbert, Deerfield Park, Dillard, Endeavour, Lake Forest, Larkdale, Lauderhill Paul Turner, Markham, Martin Luther King, Morrow, North Side, Oakland Park, Oriole, Park Lakes, Pompano, Rock Island, Royal Palm, Tedder, Thurgood Marshall, Village, Walker and Watkins.
