Teaching the Holocaust Through the Arts Vision

- "The Butterfly Project" is a call to action through education, the arts, and memorial making. It uses the lessons of the Holocaust to educate about the dangers of hatred and bigotry and cultivates empathy and social responsibility. Participants create butterflies that are displayed as symbols of resilience and hope, with the goal of creating 1.5 million butterflies around the world—one for each child who perished in the Holocaust, and honoring the survivors.
- Elementary visual art teachers are collaborating with classroom teachers and equity liaisons at school sites to implement the "The Butterfly Project" as an extension of Holocaust education.
