





Update for District 3 and Resources during the Pandemic

As our District, our community and the world are in the midst of responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, I want to ensure you that I am working to keep our staff, students and families informed by serving as a conduit of information.

Please utilize the contact information below to ask any questions you may have, and I will work to ensure your questions and issues are considered and addressed.

The Superintendent and District leaders have worked through some of the basics of how Broward County Public Schools will continue to operate through this time of social distancing and self-isolation. From delivery of technology devices to students in need, to food distribution for students who depend on breakfast and lunch meals, to ensuring payments to vendors for services rendered are being processed, to creating curriculum and providing training so educators can begin online instruction, there has been much accomplished in a short amount of time.

Thank you to all employees who are working tirelessly to meet the needs of our students, and to the students and families who have helped us navigate this transition.

Below are a few updates to be aware of:

- If you are ill, please do NOT visit a school site.
- Please remember to adhere to social distancing protocols, keeping a 6-foot distance between you and others.

- A second laptop distribution took place on Saturday, March 28th from 8 a.m. – 1 p.m. at select locations for students in need of technology devices.

- School resumes on Monday, March 30th and although we will be utilizing an online format, "attending" class regularly is important to the learning process and to our student's sense of well-being.
- On Monday, March 30 Broward County Public Schools will resume food distribution for students in need, serving grab and go breakfast and lunch at an expanded 47 locations. Breakfast will be available for pick up 8 a.m. 10 a.m. and lunch will be available for pick up 11 a.m. 1 p.m. at selected sites. Staff has worked to ensure sites were expanded based on need and a map of sites is available at the link included here. Additional sites may be added as needs are identified. Once again, please remember to adhere to social distancing protocols, keeping a 6-foot distance between you and others. If you are ill, please do NOT visit a school site. https://bit.ly/3bweJvD
- The Florida Department of Education has announced that **no standardized testing (FSA) will take place this year**, in addition state required end of course exams that are for course credit will not be given and course credit will be awarded based on students' grades.
