

## HEATHER POMPER BRINKWORTH SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER DISTRICT 3

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Thanks to everyone who voted during the primary election on August 28<sup>th</sup>. The voters support and passage of the ½ mill tax referendum for the next four years is of critical importance to maintaining and enhancing the public education system in Broward County. The funds will be available the beginning of the 2019/20 school year, and will benefit the areas of teacher compensation, increased security staff and School Resource Officers, and expanding services provided by guidance counsellors, social workers and behavioral staff. My colleagues and I on the School Board know every penny is important to our residents, and will do all in our power to be diligent watchdogs of the public's interest.

There was concern expressed by the public regarding schools being used as polling places while school was in session. The District's Legislative Affairs Office provided us with information to share that while our role is mandated by state statute (F.S.101.71 (5)), the school district recognized the sensitive nature of campus security and visitors on campus. Several new procedures were instituted to improve security. In addition, regular school security staff includes an armed school resource or safe school officers at every school. On Election Day we brought in additional temporary personnel to augment regular security staff to help monitor voters as they entered and exited school polling locations to vote. Broward County Public Schools calendar is set for schools to be closed for students on Election Day, November 6<sup>th</sup>.

With the commencement of the new school year, *SMART OFC* update meetings for the community are again being scheduled for Stranahan High and Northeast High School. These meetings will be held every other month, following the school's SAC meeting, beginning at 6:30pm. The first was held on September 12<sup>th</sup> at *Stranahan High*, and I believe the presentation has been greatly improved. See photos below of the beautiful *pool renovations* at Stranahan, which has been long-delayed and greatly anticipated. Renovation of the pool will be completed by the end of September, followed by inspection by the Health Department, and an anticipated ribbon-cutting in early October! *Single Point of Entry* is now 100% complete; *Security enhancements* are currently pending delivery of items, with completion targeted for Q4 2018. *Construction began* on Buildings 5 and 28 on September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018, to be completed in Q1 2019. Building 6 and 19 will begin Q1 2019. Remaining projects are scheduled for completion in Q4 2020. As of this writing, *Northeast High School's* SMART Office of Facilities & Construction (OFC) meeting will be held Monday evening, September 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm. With the increased allocation of funds to the Northeast projects, I anticipate very

favorable reports in the months ahead. We are finally rolling with the improvements our students so desperately need! I intend to monitor progress, and will continue to address the issues of all the District 3 schools.
