## **District 3 Happenings**

• February 6<sup>th</sup> the "*Claim Your Future*" Trade Showcase was held at the BB&T Center. Students from Fort Lauderdale High, Northeast High, Whiddon Rogers Ed Center and Stranahan High attended this career exploration fair. Over 1,000 11<sup>th</sup> grade students from across the county participated in business panel discussions, resume writing, career exploration, Magic Leap virtual experiences and job internship interviews, resulting in over 40 summer internship jobs. Business support came from the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance, BB&T Center, Bank of America, Delaware North, Wells Fargo and sixty additional businesses that created this awesome opportunity for students. *Thank you to all who attended and all who made it happen!* 

• On March 16<sup>th</sup> the *SECME STEM Olympiad* was held at Cooper City High School. District 3 schools competing were Bayview, Cypress, Floranada,

Meadowbrook, Oakland Park elementary schools, Rickards and New River middle schools, Northeast, Sheridan Tech and Stranahan high schools. I do not have the results at this time, but I know our kids did great!

• Congratulations to *Whiddon Roger's* TV Production Teacher Mr. Broderick Henry, and Music Technology Teacher, Mr. Daniel Jimenez. They were recognized as the top Canvas users in Broward County. • The 2019 ESOL Academic Competition and World Languages Academic Competition has been in progress at different locations since March 2<sup>nd</sup>.
