## EVIDENCE-BASED CURRICULUMS/PROGRAMS

Dating Matters (grades 6/6 lessons, grade 7/7 lessons) and Safe Dates (grades 8-11/10 lessons): Proven universal prevention curriculum teaches healthy relationship skills to reduce interpersonal violence.

Get Real About Violence (K-12): An 8-12-week anger management, violence prevention curriculum.

<u>Leaps</u> (K-12): An online instrument providing comprehensive lesson plans and interactive assessment tools.

Too Good for Drugs and Violence (9-12): A curriculum preventing the use of alcohol and drugs while building skills for decision making, communication, media literacy, conflict resolution, and healthy relationships.

### DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION CURRICULUM

Anti-Defamation League (K-12): Anti-bias education to create inclusive and violence free schools.

Be the 1 Positive School Culture Initiative (K-12): A 3-year violence prevention outline with tools to establish schoolwide, classroom and individual interventions.

BCPS Character Education (K-12): Monthly character newsletter with activities, lessons, and videos.

BCPS Dating Violence Policy 5010 Training Modules (6-12): Mandatory annual trainings for BCPS staff, students and parents.

<u>Classroom Meetings Toolkit</u> (K-12): Enhance relationships, increase effective communication and problem solving, while facilitating a positive, caring school climate for learning.

<u>Cloud 9 World</u> (K-5): SEL program integrating literacy to teach character strength and making wise choices.

### DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION CURRICULUM

<u>Coaching Boys to Men</u> (9-12): A coaching resource to promote respectful behavior and prevent relationship abuse, harassment, and sexual assault.

<u>CASEL</u> (PreK-12): BCPS district-wide model for SEL based on the five competencies - self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making.

<u>Dating Violence Days/Months of Observance</u> (K-12): Raise awareness with observance toolkits and lessons.

**EVERFI** (K-12): Empowers educators to bring real-world SEL skills into the classroom.

<u>Evolution Labs/Suite 360/ISSO 360</u> (K-12): SEL curriculum with quick assessments and lesson delivery through a variety of modalities.

<u>FL Coalition Against Domestic Violence</u> (staff, 7-12): Training modules for instructors and downloadable teen dating violence prevention curriculum.

<u>Health Teacher</u> (K-12): Curriculum with lessons related to health, violence prevention, and SEL.

<u>KidsHealth</u> (K-12): SEL health-related lesson plans, discussion questions, activities, handouts, and quizzes.

<u>Love is Respect</u> (6-12): A variety of resources including videos, fact sheets, and curriculum.

One Love, #ThatsNotLove (5-12): Sets of short videos with lessons to shine a spotlight on unhealthy or abusive relationship behaviors.

<u>Planting the Seeds of Prevention</u> (1-12): Three dating violence prevention lessons for each grade.

<u>Sanford Harmony</u> (PreK-6): SEL teaching program cultivating strong classroom relationships.

<u>Teaching Tolerance</u> (K-12): SEL curricula, classroom activities, and videos to create civil inclusive schools.
