EVIDENCE-BASED BULLYING PREVENTION CURRICULUM/PROGRAMS

- Dating Matters (grades 6 is 6 lessons, grade 7 is 7 lessons) Safe Dates (grades 8-11 is 10 lessons): This proven universal prevention curriculum teaches healthy relationship skills to reduce interpersonal violence.
- Get Real About Violence (K-12): An 8-12-week anger management, violence prevention curriculum.
- Too Good for Drugs and Violence (9-12): A curriculum preventing the use of alcohol and drugs while building skills for decision making, communication, media literacy, conflict resolution, and healthy relationships.
