- Enroll in on-line HOPE class during 7th - 8th summer (Optional)

- September December 2019 Guidance Visit

- October 2019 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test 8/9 (PSAT) at SSMS
- December 2019 College Visit
- January April 2020 Guidance Visit
 - Course selection for high school
 - Complete remaining HS credit requirements

- Students can earn up to 8 high school credits

Health Opportunities through Physical Education (HOPE) (Optional)

- Allows student to complete physical activity in an environment that is most comfortable for them
