WHAT IS AN AWARD LETTER?

A Letter Sent To Students By Financial Aid Offices, Listing and Describing the Funds, If any, For Which They Qualify.

- Must Complete FAFSA Application and Enter Colleges, Universities, and/or Technical Schools Accepted To.
- Must Submit Your *AWARD LETTERS* To Mrs. Raff for some may contain Scholarship Money!

KEY WORDS USED IN FINANCIAL AID AWARD LETTERS

- 1. Cost of attendance, or COA: This figure includes the amount that the school charges in tuition and fees as well as estimated school-related expenses, such as room and board, food, transportation and supplies, to name just a few.
- 2. "Gift" aid: This is money the student doesn't need to repay. Grants are usually offered by the college as need-based aid and scholarships are often merit-based.
- 3. <u>Net costs, sometimes referred to as net price</u>: This is the difference found by subtracting grants and scholarships from the total cost of attendance
- 4. Estimated family contribution, or EFC: Many schools calculate a family's ability to contribute based on the information provided on submitted financial aid forms, such as the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly known as the FAFSA.


KEY WORDS USED IN FINANCIAL AID AWARD LETTERS

- 1. Scholarships & Grants: Make sure you understand the conditions you must meet (for instance, you might have to maintain a certain grade-point average in order to continue receiving a scholarship, or your TEACH Grant might turn into a loan if you don't teach for a certain number of years under specific circumstances).
- Work-Study: You don't have to pay the money back, but you do have to work for it, so take into account that that'll mean less time for studying. However, research has shown that students who work part-time jobs manage their time better than those who don't!
- 3. Federal Student Loans: You'll have to repay the money with *interest*. Subsidized loans don't start accruing (accumulating) interest until you leave school, so accept a subsidized loan before an unsubsidized loan.
- 4. <u>Private Loans:</u> You'll have to repay the money with interest, and the terms and conditions of the loan almost certainly will not be as good as those of a federal student loan.
