

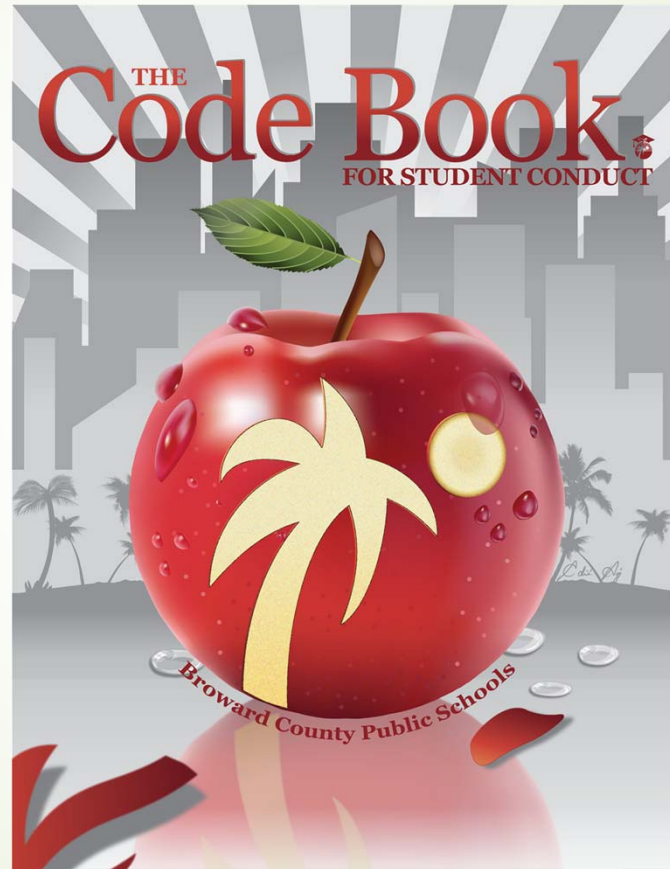

Attendance

To increase graduation rate:

Colleges & Employers are Reviewing Posts on Social Media!

- ▶ Kaplan Test Prep surveyed college admissions officials and found that two-thirds of colleges say it's "fair game" for them to review applicants' social media profiles to help them decide who gets in.

OFFENSES LEADING TO POSSIBLE SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION:

- ▶ Over The Counter Medications, Use, Possession, Sale, and/or Transmittal of
- ▶ Drug and Substance Abuse Infractions
- ▶ Use, possession, and/or being under the influence of mood-altering substances
- ▶ Use/Possession of Unauthorized Substances
- ▶ Possession of Unauthorized Prescription Medications
- ▶ Being Under The Influence of Unauthorized Substances
- ▶ Sale, Attempted Sale, and/or Transmittal of Drugs or Mood-Altering Substances
- ▶ Sale, Attempted Sale, and/or Transmittal of Alcohol or Alcoholic Beverages
- ▶ Other Offenses (Non-Drug and Non-Substance Abuse Offenses)
- ▶ Repeatedly committing serious breaches of conduct
- ▶ Commit an Assault
- ▶ Commit a Battery
- ▶ Commits or threatens to commit vandalism/damage to property




OFFENSES LEADING TO POSSIBLE SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION:

- Commits any act on campus or off campus that substantially disrupts orderly conduct of classes or school activities
- Commits Grand Theft, including motor vehicle theft
- Commits an act of Hazing
- Commits a physical attack
- Commits a sexual assault
- Possesses and/or displays or transmits a Class B weapon
- Use of laser pens/pointers and other laser devices that could potentially harm or injure another individual
- Makes an internet/electronic transmission of a threat to do harm to person(s) on school grounds, or to school property, that result in a substantial disruption to the school climate
- Conducts, recruits, or participates on campus in a formal or informal gang activity
- Transmit or distribute inappropriate images that violate the rights of other individuals
- Commits other criminal actions
- Use the school district's technology and/or software for any unauthorized purpose



OFFENSES LEADING TO MANDATORY SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION:

- ▶ Bringing a firearm or weapon to school or any school sponsored activity
- ▶ Making threats or False reporting involving school or school's personnel's property, school transportation, or a school-sponsored activity
- ▶ Threats to throw, project, place or discharge destructive devices with intent to do bodily harm
- ▶ Students committing Other Serious Offenses that pose a serious threat to school safety such as:
- ▶ Serious Assault
- ▶ Arson or attempted arson
- ▶ Sexual Battery or attempted sexual battery
- ▶ Homicide
- ▶ Kidnapping or abduction
- ▶ Bringing, possessing, using or selling explosive/destructive devices
- ▶ Robbery or attempted robbery
- ▶ Armed robbery or attempted armed robbery
- ▶ Serious Battery
- ▶ Battery on a school board employee, sports official, or other specified officials
- ▶ Battery on a Law Enforcement Officer, Firefighter, and Emergency Medical Care Provider



Positive Behavior Support Incentives

- Dress for Success – Passports
- Perfect Attendance
- Student-Athlete of the Month
- Principal's Straight A Honor Roll
- VIP Pass (No Tardies/Detentions)
- Student Achievement & College Scholarship Celebrations



Suspension Consequences

- Internal Suspension **MAY** result in loss of senior privileges (Grad Bash, Prom. BBQ).
- External Suspension **WILL** result in loss of senior privileges (Grad Bash, Prom. BBQ).


Graduation Requirements

- At least a 2.0 unweighted GPA
- 24 specific credits
 - 4 credits of English
 - 4 credits of Math;
 - 1 must be Algebra 1 with EOC
 - 1 must be Geometry with EOC for 30% of final grade
 - 3 credits of Science;
 - 1 must be Biology with EOC for 30% of final grade
 - 3 credits of Social Studies;
 - World History
 - US History with EOC for 30% of final grade
 - US Gov/Econ
 - HOPE (2 years of JROTC satisfies this requirement.)
- Online course
- 1 credit Performing Arts, Speech or Debate, eligible Practical Arts
- 6-8 elective credits




Graduation Requirements

- Passing score on the FSA reading, or passing score on the ACT/SAT
- Passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC, or concordant PERT score to earn credit
- Very important! If you take an EOC course, you **MUST** take the EOC to receive credit for completion of the course!!!
- Students must earn 40 community service hours



How do I know if I have met the graduation requirements?

- Check Virtual Counselor!
 - Counselors will be meeting with you through Study Hall classes to discuss your “Senior Letter” – a document that lists all the graduation requirements and your status.

- ▶ Apply for Free/Reduced Lunch at www.applyforlunch.com. Must be completed every school year!
- ▶ Upcoming College Entrance Exam Dates
 - ▶ **ACT Test on October 27th** / Register by **September 28th**
 - ▶ **SAT Test on October 6th** / Register by **September 7th**
- ▶ College Visits & Presentations will be held during 12th Grade STUDY HALL PERIODS. To attend a College Visit at Piper, you must complete your “College List” on Naviance/Family Connection account.

FAFSA & FFAA/BRIGHT FUTURES

- Application for both FAFSA & FFAA opens up for SENIORS ONLY on October 1, 2018.

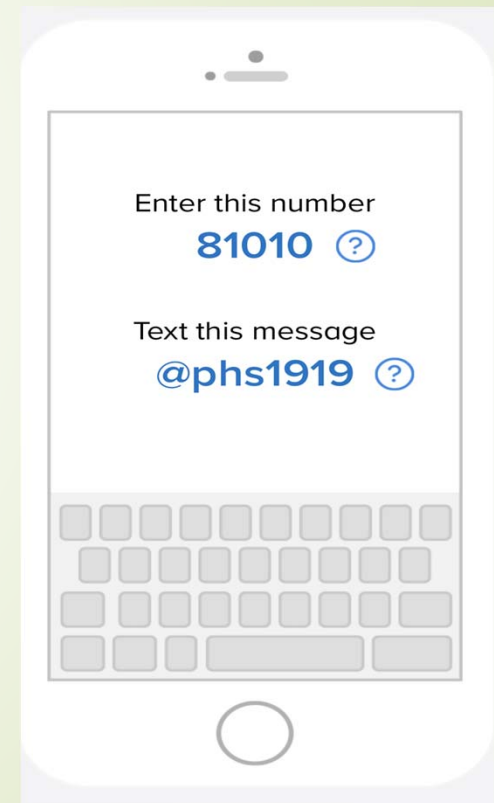
