Classroom Behavior Management Tips **(reprint)**

As the school year enters the final quarter it is a given fact that students (and staff) are experiencing some sort of "burnout" due to intensive assessment preparation, etc. This can lead to all sorts of behavioral difficulties which can make the final months of school very difficult. It is certainly not a time to relax your classroom management plans and expectations. Here are a few tips to make the final months palatable.

-Create an effective reward system that encourages good behavior. While you should not have to bribe students to behave praising good behavior promotes a better classroom environment.

-Speak with "problem students" on a one-on-one basis rather than addressing the student in front of the class. By focusing on the "problem student" in front of the class you disturb class time for all students. Often this encourages students to misbehave in order to get attention in front of an audience.

-Remain calm when dealing with misbehaviors. Over reacting leads to more misbehaviors, in many cases. By remaining calm, you show authority and project confidence.

-Maintain consistency (most important)-If one student is reprimanded for misbehaving while another is not, other students may misbehave, knowing that they will receive discipline only some of the time.
