**Maintaining Instructional Momentum by
Establishing an Effective Management
System**

Many educational theorists support the premise that effective authentic instruction can pre-empt behavioral difficulties in classrooms. Learning Sciences International (LSI) suggests a few simple engagement strategies that can deter poor behavior such as: making eye contact with each student, using proximity control by circulating thus ensuring that students are indeed on task, attributing ownership of ideas to individual students, and encouraging all students to participate by utilizing a randomized system to ask questions. A randomized questioning system forces all students to participate in the lesson not just those that are raising their hands on a continuous basis. It also alerts the teacher whether or not students are comprehending what is presented.
