Fourth Grade

A whole-hearted thank you to the families who joined us for our conference night on November 7th. Our team was pleased to speak with you about your child's progress. We honored to travel this academic journey with you and your family. In Language Arts this month our focus will be on how characters contribute to plot and explaining a theme and how it develops. We will continue to practice summarizing with an emphasis on plot and theme. In Math we are multiplying by double digits using various cycles and we are incorporating the historical events of November in Social Studies. As we continue to celebrate the successes and learn from the challenges, please continue to read with your child daily and help them memorize Math facts.

Second Grade

Hello families! We had a wonderful time on our first field trip. We enjoyed touring the Percy White Library! Please take your child to visit and return the library card application to them at your visit. Tuesdays at 4pm would be great for the kids! They have slime time! Remember to practice having your child retell in full detail the books they read. Practice making connections to what you read. Does the book remind you of something. It could be another book or even a memory. Also, have them think about the theme of stories. Explain what the author's message (or lesson) is that they want the reader to learn after reading.

First Grade

We have been enjoying some fall fun in first grade! In reading we are focusing on character development and practicing our fluency and comprehension skills. We love using our online programs and other tools to help us reach our reading goals! Our book fair was this month and we had so much fun exploring all the books and choosing some to take home. This month we also celebrated fire safety and had a wonderful presentation from our local firefighters. We learned a lot about how to be prepared and safe in case of a fire. In class we also learned about common and proper nouns and adjectives. In math our focus was subtracting to 20 and learning many strategies to help us solve equations and real-world math problems. In science, we also learned about bones and how to keep our bodies healthy and strong! Don't forget to read every night and complete your weekly homework!

Third Grade

Our third graders have been working hard towards mastering those multiplication and division facts. Please don't forget to buy flash cards and use Reflex Math to study those facts. We will be moving into area and perimeter nextso the more they know those facts- the easier it will be for them. For reading, we've been practicing summarizing, central ideas, and comparing and contrasting with fables, folktales, and poems.. We're also practicing being able to tell the author's point of view and author's perspective of the story. Please continue to have your child read at home and fill in their reading minutes on their paper reading logs or electronically through the Bean Stack app for Mr. Gerlach's reading challenge.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

The Kindergarten Team had a very exciting first quarter! First, we had the opportunity to experience the G.A.B.I.E Bus. Each student was able to plant their own seed. Then we had a visit from the Fire Department. Students learned about fire safety and were able to tour a fire truck! Lastly, we all got to parade around our school in DBES's very first Halloween Parade. What a great start to our year! This quarter we are continuing to work on mastering our letter names and sounds. We will be learning about characters, setting, and key details in a text. In math, we will begin working on comparing numbers 1-10! Parents, please continue to check your child's bookbag daily for important information. The Kindergarten Team is looking forward to another successful quarter!
