# A Word From Our Teach ers

#### Dear Parents/Guardians

Kindergarten continues to work on school and classroom rules, procedures and routines. In Language Arts, students are continuing to work on identifying upper and lowercase letter names, letter sounds, and concepts of print: identifying the front and back covers, title of the book, role of an author and illustrator, reading from left to right, the difference between a letter and a word, words are made up by letters and spaces, punctuation marks and when we use each of them (period, question mark, exclamation mark, and quotation marks), using spaces between words, knowing where to begin reading with the first word on the page and where the last word on the page is, voice to print pairing and recognizing that pictures may support meaning in the text, etc. Students are learning to identify the topic and multiple details in a text, use Titles, Headings, and Illustrations to predict and confirm the topic, ask and answer questions about unfamiliar words, create mental images as they read, using text features to build knowledge about a text, and identifying whether a text is fiction or non-fiction (also, known as informational text). In Math, students have

(also, known as informational text). In Math, students have been learning to identify numbers 0 through 10, count groups of objects to tell and write the numeral to tell how many, and comparing numbers: identifying if numbers are equal, which number is less than, and greater than, and number sequence. In Social Studies, students have been learning what makes a person a responsible citizen by making good citizens, making good and bad decisions, and

problem solving. In Science, students are learning about The Practice of Science, using your Five Senses, Properties of Objects: how to compare and classify objects according to color, size, shape, texture, and temperature.

Please work with your students at home to practice saying their letter names, letter sounds, how to hold a pencil correctly, and to write their name.

SECOND GRADE NEWS: It's fall y'all and we are halfway through the 1st guarter! This week, in math, we are finishing up Topic 3, and will take the Topic 1-3 Cumulative Test. Your child has learned a variety of strategies to help them add and the foundations for multiplication. Please reinforce the math skills taught in class by checking your child's homework after they have completed it independently. In reading, students will take the Unit 1 Assessment that measures the phonics, comprehension, grammar, and writing skills taught within the last 3 weeks of school. As we begin Unit 2, students will be applying various reading comprehension skills such as making inferences based on texts, retelling stories, using context clues, analyz-ing theme, story structure and elements, making connections through texts, and responding to character perspectives. In writing, we will begin writing an opinion essay. Students will read a mentor text, use text evidence to support characters and to make an opinion, and analyze author's conclusion. Thank you for your support!

We have had a wonderful start to the school year, with seven weeks of instruction behind us, students are rising to the challenge of

the new school year. It was an absolute pleasure meeting with parents yesterday at our first conference night. We celebrated milestones and discussed challenges, and devised solutions that we know will increase student learning. The fourth-grade team has been working tirelessly to prepare your child for success with exciting and engaging lessons. We are starting a new unit in reading and continuing with multiplying double digit by double digits in Math. Science this year has been interactive with multiple experi-

ments and hands on lessons, we are currently exploring the Properties of Water unit with engaging hands-on lessons. Students created wonderful drawings of Florida and labeled important geographical features for our Social Studies unit. Kudos to parents and students who participate in our weekly

Sunshine Math practice as well as our Reading challenge. Together we shine!

Don't forget your first graders have homework every night and should be reading for at least 20 minutes and logging their minutes in Beanstack. They can also review their skills on Iready. Hi families! Third Grade is learning many new and exciting things. We are in Multiplication and moving to Division. In Reading we are working on central idea, compare and contrast, and creating mental images. In Science we are learning about matter. We have booked our first field trip. On October 29th we will be going on a SEAS trip to see Little Monster Tales. It will cost \$3.00. Be on the look out for the permission slip. Please make sure that they are reading daily for at least 20 minutes. They need to do the reading log on Beanstack. This is found on Clever. They need to practice flashcards daily and complete their math homework.



Dear Parents, We have been busy, busy, busy in fifth grade. Your child should be doing a deep dive into decimals, one way to help at home is to have them add up the grocery list and tell you how much change you get back from a restaurant. Also please encourage the joy of reading by reading along side your child. In science we are studying matter, cooking with you is a great example of a chemical change. In the near future look out for a permission slip to a play and information regarding grade level shirts.

> This month during guidance lessons we have been talking about problem and reaction size. Students were taught that reactions need to match the size of the small, medium, or big problem. For example, if you were erasing something and made a little hole in the paper, that would be a small problem. Ripping up the paper and refusing to do any more work would be a big reaction. An appropriate, small reaction, to match the problem size

> would be to work around the hole or ask for a new paper if needed. Nobody is perfect! I have encouraged students to reflect if they notice they have reacted too small or too big to a problem. You can help your child reflect on this practice by using this resource!
