- Performing a 10–15-minute student written scene
- The written portion consists of two essays from the perspective of actors, directors, or designers in relation to two published plays that are read prior to the assessment



ASSESSMENT OBJECTIVES

1. Knowledge and Understanding: Candidates demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of drama text and its performance context, and of theatre-making traditions and theatre practice.

2. Devising

Candidates demonstrate skill and creativity in devising original pieces of theatre for group performance.

3. Performing Candidates demonstrate acting skills in performing a range of text-based materials.

4. Analyzing and Evaluating Candidates demonstrate the ability to analyze and reflect on their own performance practice and devising processes; candidates evaluate their own work and that of playwrights, performers or theatre-makers.
