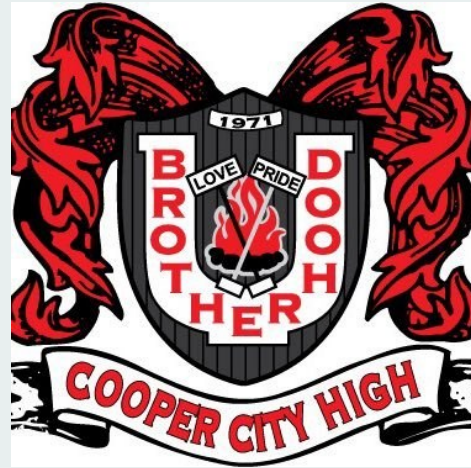

AICE GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES

Global Perspective's focus is on critical analysis and reflection on issues of global significance. The skills gained through Global Perspectives enable students to meet the demands of twenty-first century learning and to make a successful transition to study in higher education.

The 7 Global Themes

*Technology *Science *Politics *Culture
*Economics *Environment *Ethics

Framework to explore issues

- Learn skills not content
- Think critically to deconstruct arguments
- Apply logical approach to make decisions
- Analyze context of arguments
- Organize information and communicate effectively

Global Perspectives Course Content

GP will be divided into roughly three parts. The first third of the year will be teaching students to learn and master reading and writing techniques, citation, analysis of various formats of sources and presentation skills. The second third of the year will be devoted to completing components 2 and 3. The remaining third will be spent on the presentations and preparation for component 1.

Students will practice each of the components prior to beginning the ones submitted to Cambridge for scoring.

Expectations

Students will conduct the bulk of their research and writing in class using school computers. At home, students are expected to have access to a computer and printer with internet and cloud access in order to complete assignments and conduct further research. Consistent attendance and on time submission of work is critical to success in this course.

Summer Assignment

All students will be required to complete a summer writing assignment due at the start of class in August.

PREREQUISITES

To be successful in AICE Global, students are expected to have a strong independent word ethic, consistent attendance as well as strong writing and presentation skills.

Assessment Overview

Global Perspectives scores are based upon the following:

Component 1–

Written exam based upon supplied articles

Component 2–

2000 word research based argumentative paper on a global issue

Component 3–

6-8 minutes research based presentation based upon a local issue
