BENEFITS

- AP provides students the opportunity to take university-level classes while still in high school.
- AP courses develop college level academic skills by digging deeper into subjects, requiring students to hone their time management and study skills while tapping into their creativity and problem solving skills.
- College credit is awarded if the student passes the AP exam with a 3 or higher. AP credits are accepted internationally. Always check with potential colleges prior to taking classes.
- AP courses stand out in the college admission process because they demonstrate academic rigor.
- AP offers additional quality points in the weighted GPA.
- Passing score on AP US History or AP Government exam may be used to meet the new Civics graduation requirement.

- Students can earn the AP Capstone Diploma by earning a 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on 4 additional AP exams of their choosing.
- AP Seminar and Research Certificate is granted to students who earn scores of 3 or higher in both AP Seminar and AP Research.
- AP Scholar Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.

OUR COURSE

Students enrolled in the AP English Language and Composition course are often immersed in global topics where they are challenged to develop their writing style through analysis of varied non-fiction texts. Students are to assert their positions through well thought out essays. The AP exam assesses students' ability to dissect a variety of texts, synthesize information from various sources, and forge well-defended arguments.
