Some interventions we employ to improve the academic performance of students include:

- Common school wide intervention time using the "Walk to Read" method.
- Identified tier 2 and tier 3 intervention teachers
- Use of DRA, letter names and sounds, math diagnostic, and iReady diagnostic data to identify student areas of weaknesses.
- · Monitoring of student attendance
- Implementation of tier interventions in ELA and math.
- · Grade level meetings with RTI facilitator to analyze student data and progress monitor to further determine student needs.
- Monthly CPST meetings with parents to communicate and analyze progress monitoring data.
- Monthly LEAPs focus and weekly implementation to target social and emotional needs of students.



Goals

As evidenced in the SES Band Data, which content area(s) will be the focus for improving student achievement?

By June 2016, the percent of students proficiency in science will increase from 37% to 45%.

What BEST Practice(s) will be scaled-up to improve teaching and learning in order to increase performance within the SES Band?

The BEST practices that will be scaled up to improve teaching and learning in order to increase performance are:

Alignment of instruction with state adopted standards at the appropriate level of rigor.

Sequencing of lessons and concepts to insure coherence and required prior knowledge.

Selecting appropriate formative assessments to monitor learning.

Use of a variety of data in collaboration with colleagues to evaluate learning outcomes, adjust planning and continuously improve the effectiveness of lessons. Students will be held accountable for their academic achievements.

Describe how the BEST Practice(s) will be scaled-up.

Grade level teams will meet to plan and sequence instruction for students to achieve mastery.

Grade level teams will select or create appropriate formative assessments aligned with the Florida State Standards to monitor learning.

Grade level teams will meet in PLC meetings to analyze and apply data from multiple assessments to diagnose students' learning needs, and drive the learning progress.

Utilizing learning scales and rubrics, students will monitor their individual level of understanding on a daily basis until they achieve their end goal.

Students will be held accountable for their individual progress, utilizing the SWAG folder (Students With Academic Goals)

Students will track and reflect on their achievements using this tool. Students will be responsible for writing and monitoring their personal academic goal.

Instructional Implications: Discuss the success of specific strategies/activities and provide a rationale as to why those academic improvements occurred as a result of those strategies.

During our grade level PLC meetings, best practices for remediation and enrichment are shared. Learning gaps are identified in specific subject areas and data is analyzed from multiple assessments. Using the above information, measures to diagnose students' needs and plans are made accordingly.

With the use of visible scales and rubrics, students are made aware of their expected target and their current level of understanding.

Using the SWAG folders, students are given the opportunity to create graphs and track their individual achievements towards grade level skill mastery.

The SWAG folders serve as a visual aid to assist and motivate student awareness of their progress.
