IMPORTANT SECURITY UPDATE Metal Detectors

Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) students, parents and staff, starting on the first day of school, August 12, 2024, all students and visitors entering BCPS high schools must pass through metal detectors monitored by security personnel and school staff.

The District asks parents and families to support this initiative by ensuring that students are aware of the system and prepared to follow new procedures. Beginning this year, high school entry points have been consolidated to ensure all students are screened for weapons prior to entering the school.

Students must wear their IDs to pass through the detectors. They can carry their backpacks or bags and will not need to empty pockets or remove shoes, cellphones, keys, metal on clothes or belts as those items will not alert the system. Some items will result in an alert and must be placed on adjacent tables to be screened by security staff. These include laptops, large eyeglass cases, musical instruments, umbrellas and 3-ring binders. These items can be collected once students are cleared for entry.

This added security measure at high schools may result in slight delays at entry. Parents and students should plan accordingly.

Panther Nation: Expectations

Student ID Policy: Policy 5.8

Broward County Public Schools' Code of Conduct requires students to wear their official, unaltered, and current school-issued ID badge at all times while on campus and on school-sponsored transportation. The ID must be visible on the front of the student's person and worn to enter campus each day. If a student's ID is lost or stolen, they can get a replacement for a cost of \$5.00.

Visitors to Broward County Public Schools campuses must also wear a district-issued ID badge, volunteer badge, or site-based visitor badge at all times. Visitors who don't have a badge must either leave campus or get the appropriate badge right away.

STUDENT ID POLICY

Identification badges are an important part of the Dillard 6-12 School plan to increase campus safety. All students are expected to wear their ID badges at all times during the school day.

ID Badges and Replacements

Each scholar will be issued a new Student ID badge during the first week of the new school year at no cost to the student or parent. Students who forget/misplace their ID Badge will be allowed to replace their ID Badge for \$5.00.

Monitoring Plan (Consequences)

Failure to wear the student issued ID badge in accordance with policy 5.8 is a violation of the SBBC Code of Student Conduct. ID Badges are apart of Dillard 6-12 Unified Dress Code Policy and must be worn around the neck at all times, and is needed to enter each classroom. Repeated offenses are subject to progressive disciplinary according to our discipline matrix which includes detention, in-school suspension (ISS), and/or out of school suspension (OSS).

Senior scholars with repeated offenses may be prevented from participating in school activities such as homecoming, prom, Grad Bash, pep rallies, athletic events and other similar



- All eligible students must register for bus transportation. This ensures that each student is assigned to a route, allowing for efficient planning and safety.
