Principal Report:

Mrs. Judith Pitter greeted everyone and discussed the SMART Bond Initiative from the District, we received \$100,000. We were able to purchase improvements around the school such as electronic marquee, renovate the school's entrance/front office, as well as the security measure for one point of entry. We also purchased benches in front of school, curtains for the cafeteria stage and audio system, computer lab carts. We have the availability to have 1 to computers from 5th to K" Our Pre-K/Head Start Students use IPADS daily. Our 3, 4, 5th grades use Recordex and the Music Program was designated with \$50.000 for upgrades in instruments that was well deserved.

We passed out a handout describing the various programs SAC/ SAF/PTA-PTO
Our school has Parent Teacher Organization (PTO).

Our parents are encouraged to participate in the School Advisory Forum (SAF) this organization provides a voice to the committee whom makes recommendations to the School district from the parents who have joined the SAF. Such examples are boundary changes, school calendar etc.

Mrs. Pitter informed the parents our school maintained "C" 3 points away from "B" and emphasizes the Safety and security measures needed for such a time we are living in. Mrs. Pitter reiterated that the SAC is so very important in decision making for the school's instructional resources (afterschool tutorial programs, etc.) and the budget SAC utilize in Accountability Funds to fulfill the needs throughout the school year.

Parent concerns: Will there be another \$100,000 for the school? No, it was a one-time only Bond voted on by voters.

Safety Concerns: Why was there a Lock down at dismissal? When there a situation and the school safety is first priority. There's a protocol and process that has to be followed. Mrs. Pitter apologized for the inconvenience.

Parent ask about what was the schedule for her son pertaining to PE? The time for daily student's recess is 20 minutes and for PE is 35 minutes once a week.
