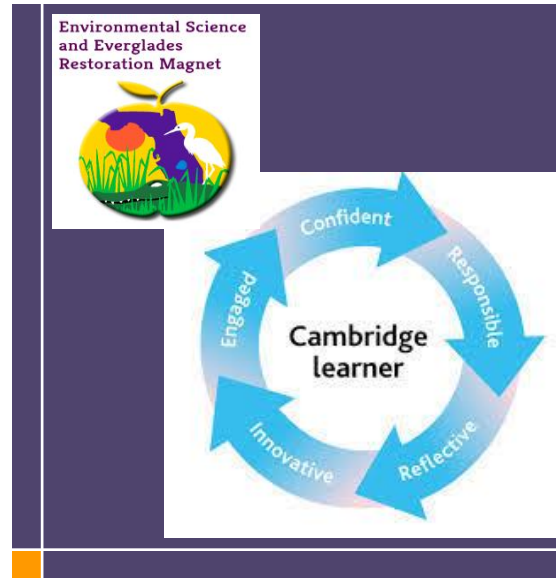




AICE Diploma Option

AICE is similar to IB and AP programs where students can choose a couple of classes or commit to the diploma track. Students must pass seven (7) AICE courses and exams across four categories of study within 25 months of taking their first exam to earn the AICE diploma.

Students who earn the AICE Diploma and complete 100 community service hours in high school automatically earn the **Florida Bright Futures Academic Scholars** tuition scholarship with no restrictions on GPA or test scores.

South Plantation High School Cambridge International AS Level Curriculum

South Plantation High School was certified as a Cambridge Center school in 2019 and joins nearly a million students in over 10,000 Cambridge schools in 160 countries. As part of our rigorous and innovative Environmental Science and Everglades Restoration Magnet curriculum, students participate in **AICE courses** with the option to take classes a la carte or pursue the **AICE diploma** track.

For the 2021-2022 school year, students will be able to select from courses such as English General Paper, Thinking Skills, English Language, Environmental Management, International History, Marine Science, Biology, Psychology, Travel & Tourism, Drama, and Global Perspectives.

Over 600 colleges and universities in the U.S. give credit and placement for Cambridge exams, including all in the State of Florida as well as Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Duke University, Columbia University, New York University, University of Washington, University of Virginia, and many others.

AICE classes are weighted similarly to AP, IB and Dual Enrollment classes (**6.0 scale**) and most have a higher pass rate than AP or IB classes.

A research study from Florida State University, including more than 8,500 incoming freshmen students from 2007-2010, found that Cambridge students' freshmen year GPA was statistically equivalent to AP students and higher than IB students. All three groups earned higher freshman year GPA's compared to students who did not earn credit through an advanced program.
