

Our program goals are to promote progress in student academics as it relates to their grade level curriculum standards and their IEP goals. We thrive in encouraging student independence, communication needs, and social skills. Additionally, we cater to student's behavior and emotional needs all through a variety of evidence-based approaches as it pertains to each individual student.

Additionally, we would like to welcome our newest staff members, Ms. Shanice Bedward and Mrs. Lisandra Milite, to the team! Ms. Bedward comes from Atlantic West Elementary and Mrs. Milite comes from Park Springs Elementary. We are so glad to have them!

Kindergarten

The Kindergarteners are off to an amazing start! Our students have settled in nicely and seem very happy with their first experiences at CCES. Friendships are being formed, social skills such as turn-taking and being kind to others are continuously worked on throughout the school day.

The students are working hard to grow into strong readers, thinkers, and problem solvers. We have been discovering all about how to make observations in Science. In Reading we are learning our foundational skills and are getting set to become readers! In math, we have been practicing representing, counting, and writing numbers to 10.

First Grade, Second Grade, & Third Grade

First Grade:

Welcome to the new school year!

First grade is moving along and learning new things daily. In Math, we are working on addition and subtraction to twenty. To practice at home, you can use coins, clips, or any other item to add and subtract. In Reading, we are working on establishing routines and procedures. We are learning good listening habits, the difference between nonfiction and fiction texts, and turn and talk using constructive conversations. We are still learning the rules and procedures of the school as well.

Second Grade:

Welcome Aboard 2nd grade students to our 2024-2025 school year! We are so excited for this upcoming school year. We enjoyed seeing parents and students at Open House to discuss important information about our classroom.

Uniforms need to be worn daily with shoes/sneakers for safety reasons. Snacks can be brought in daily since we have a late lunch time. Students must return the Communications folder daily for important papers. Students are reviewing Reading and Math skills, so they are ready for 2nd grade. Teachers will reach out to parents to schedule a conference to discuss individual progress. 1st Quarter Interims will go home September 27th. The 2nd grade teachers are ready to help, so please reach out to your child's teacher for any questions/concerns.

Third Grade:

Hello from the Third Grade Team,

Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year. We are excited to work with our students and encourage them to always do their best. In Math, we are working on Topic 2 which is using Patterns for Foundational Multiplication Facts. In ELA, we are working on Unit 1, Animal Adaptations. Students will be reading and comparing selections about animals and plants to understand how living things grow and change. In Science, we are working on classifying matter.

We want to encourage students to read for 20 minutes a day and to practice their multiplication and division strategies. We also want to remind families that headphones are needed for classroom use. We are looking forward to a year that is anchored in student "A"chievement.

Fourth Grade & Fifth Grade

Fourth Grade:

Welcome to the 2024- 2025 school year at CCES! Fourth Grade teachers are delighted to be teaching your child this year. Our fourth-grade teachers are Ms. Millen, Ms. Hanlan, and Ms. Craig. This year we will take a deeper dive into curriculum, discovering new strategies and topics, sailing us on a voyage to SUCCESS! We will learn to work and collaborate as a crew, aiding in our "No scholar falls overboard" policy.

This month of reading, we will be reading a Personal Essay and a Realistic Fiction Text. To begin with, "A Bird's Free Lunch" describes the author's observations of birds in his window. "The Reeds and the River" is a story about a girl moving to a new home and eventually drifting downstream in a boat. We will recommend Read for 20 minutes, then write 2-3 sentences about what you read. Research your favorite bird and learn about where it lives. Use descriptive words to describe a scene from your window.

This month of math, Topic 1 extends your child's understanding of place value to one million. Your child will compare and round numbers using the relationship between the values of digits indifferent places. Your child will learn the names for three periods, or groupings, of place value. Even though this topic involves numbers through the thousands period only, the millions period is shown so that your child can see the structure of the periods.

Fifth Grade:

Fifth grade teachers are so excited to start the school year with our students! Our fifth-grade teachers are Ms. Joseph, Mrs. Ridgely, and Mrs. Van Sciver. For the month of September, our students will be working in our reading series-Benchmark Advance. We have already begun to explore the topic of "Cultivating Natural Resources" and "Developing Characters Relationships." We will be incorporating reading/writing, science, and social studies topics in our reading series. Look for little readers coming home after the unit is complete. Students will be able to keep and build their own home library with those readers! Continue to work on multiplication tables daily as we will continue with number sense including place value through the millions and decimals in our new math series, Envision. Please check planners and take-home folders daily for important information. Please make sure your student has a water bottle and headphones daily at school. We would love to have all of our families join our PTA this year! Thank you for your continued support!
