Reading-Benchmark Universe, Unit 5, Advancements in Technology Standard RI.1.3- Key ideas and details describe the relationship between a series of historical events, scientific ideas or concepts or steps in technical procedures in text, using language that pertains to time, sequence, and cause/effect.

Math-GO Math, Chapter 6 Understand Division

Standard 3.OA.A.2- Interpret wholenumber quotients of whole numbers, e.g., interpret  $56 \div 8$  as the number of objects in each share when 56 objects are partitioned equally into 8 shares, or as several shares when 56 objects are partitioned into equal shares of 8objects each.

A daily reminder, please ensure that your child completes a daily i-Ready lesson in reading/math with a passing score of 70% or higher.

The FSA will be administered in April and May.


#### Water Bottles

Helping students develop good reading habits has many positive effects. Academic growth is one of those effects. Reading helps develop vocabulary, increases attention span and reading stamina, expands thought processes and promotes analytical thinking. Reading more helps us see that there are many ways to look at the same thing. Perspective and point of view is something students have been learning about in class.

One way to develop good reading habits is by reading with your child at home. This helps them see reading as fun and motivates them to read more. You can read the same book along with your child or read your own book as your child reads theirs! Be a role model for reading! After reading, have conversations. Make connections between what was read to daily life. Ask what their favorite part was and why. Help them express their thoughts verbally and expand their vocabulary.

Sometimes having a dedicated space to read is helpful. That space can have several types of books to choose from along with some writing paper and pencils. In school, students are learning to take notes about things they find interesting, things they want to learn more about, or things they have questions about. But I say anywhere they want to cozy up with a good book (or ipad) is the perfect place to read!

This month, students will be learning about Technology and Society in their Benchmark Advance reading. They will be asked such things as to describe or explain events and to tell what happened and why be referring to specific information in the text. So please help them be specific in their speech when describing what happens, why and in what sequence.


#### Dates to remember

This line is open 24 hours/7 days a week for your convenience. Absence excusals must be received within 48 hours of the absence.

Your child's attendance is important to us here at CCES! The Broward Truancy Intervention Program (BTIP) program is designed to prevent excessive absences through parent notification and accountability, school interventions and daily monitoring of attendance. Parents who do not comply are referred to the State Attorney's Office for failure to comply with Florida Status 1003.27 which provides that a parent commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided by law, if the parent refuses or fails to have a child attend school regularly or refuses to participate in meetings concerning the child's truancy.

## **Transportation Changes**

Please note, that due to security reasons, changes to your child's transportation status cannot be delivered via telephone. This is for the safety of your child, as we cannot safely identify callers via the telephone. Please help us by sending any changes with your child in writing to be delivered to the teacher. Thank you for helping us to get our students home safely.
